REPORT OF THE AREA LIAISON OFFICER

CAPITAL ALLOCATIONS - RECOMMENDATIONS

Summary of New Applications by Ward

QUARRY BANK & DUDLEY WOOD

1. Saltwells Youth Club

The recommendation is that this Club be awarded a capital grant of £3,250.00 to purchase youth club equipment, <u>provided</u> that it can be reported to the Committee that all the necessary supporting documentation is in order and has been received by the Area Liaison Officer.

NETHERTON, WOODSIDE & ST ANDREWS

2. Age Concern Dudley

The recommendation is that this organization be awarded a capital grant of £3.860.00 to purchase 5 computers, licenses, software, a printer and a storage cupboard.

3. New Testament Welfare Association

The recommendation is that this association be awarded a capital grant of \pounds 3,476.00 to renovate the outside entrance and the floor of the dining / activity area and also lay new carpeting.

ST JAMES'S

4. Milking Bank Friends

The recommendation is that this group be awarded a capital grant of £13,000 to contribute to a project commissioned by DUE which is the de-silting of the Milking Bank Pond and the establishment of a multi-use games area. If approved, the grant monies will be transferred directly to DUE.

ST THOMAS'S

5. **St Thomas's Community Network – Out of School Club (OOSC)** The recommendation is that this organization be awarded a capital grant of £8411.07 for the adaptation of rooms for the OOSC at the main Network site.

6. Friends of Buffery Park

The recommendation is that this group be awarded a capital grant of £5,000.00 to contribute to a project commissioned by DUE, which is the resurfacing of

derelict tennis courts in the park, where a new Multi-Use Games Area is to be sited. If approved, the grant monies will be transferred directly to DUE. But with the <u>proviso</u> that it must be reported to the Committee that all the supporting documentation is in order and has been received by the Area Liaison Officer.

It can now be reported that satisfactory accounts and a copy of their constitution have been received from the organization. Also received has been detailed information from the Economic Regeneration Division of the DUE on the work being undertaken in Buffery Park.

7. St Thomas's Community Games Association

The recommendation is that this group be awarded £5,000.00 to contribute to a range of equipment that will be used during the games and by the community e.g. generator, walkie-talkie radios, megaphones, podium, stopwatches and folding tables. This is <u>provided</u> that all the necessary supporting documentation is in order and has been received by the Area Liaison Officer.
