



Off Licences Social Responsibility protocol

Social Responsibility Scheme

This protocol is to be introduced amongst off licences in areas where there is considered to be a problem of binge drinking amongst young people leading to crime and anti social behaviour, as well as having a detrimental impact on a young person's health and wellbeing. Signing up to the protocol would demonstrate that a retailer is acting responsibly in the interests of young people and the wider community and could be used to support any licence application in terms of meeting the 4 licensing objectives i.e. the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm.

Criteria for such a scheme, depending upon local circumstances will include:

a) PASS (Proof of age standards scheme) that prohibits sale of alcohol to anyone under 21 years. Posters / literature could be displayed in shops promoting "No Proof - No Sale" policy.

b) Training and accreditation of staff which could include guidance form young people on how to avoid under age sales, intimidation and conflict.

c) Establishing radio / text pager schemes linked to Police (similar to town centre pub watch schemes).

d) Undertaking measures to discourage young people congregating outside retail premises e.g. removal of low level walls and improving external lighting etc.

e) Offering financial incentives / support to retailers who have signed up but are experiencing resulting hardship.
