## REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR OF LAW AND PROPERTY

## APPLICATION TO VARY A PREMISES LICENCE

### **PURPOSE**

To consider the application for variation of the premises licence in respect of The Crown, 12, Barrack Lane, Halesowen, West Midlands.

#### BACKGROUND

- On the 24<sup>th</sup> November, 2005, an application was received from Ridgeway Licensing Services, in respect of The Crown, 12, Barrack Lane, Halesowen, West Midlands, to vary a premises licence. The application for variation of licence is attached to this report at Appendix 1.
- 3 The application had the following documents enclosed:-

  - · Plan of the premises
- On the 19<sup>th</sup> September, 2005, an application to convert the licence was granted we have now received an application to vary this licence, this is as follows:

To allow sale of alcohol and regulated entertainment (films/indoor sporting events)

Mon – Thurs 10.00 – 00.00 Fri & Sat 10.00 – 03.00 Sun 10.00 – 00.00

Regulated entertainment (live music/recorded music/performance dance/provision of facilities for making music/dance)

Mon – Thurs 19.00 – 23.00 Fri & Sat 19.00 – 00.00 Sun 19.00 – 23.00 Provision of facilities for late night refreshment

Mon – Thurs 23.00 – 00.00 Fri & Sat 23.00 – 03.00 Sun 23.00 – 00.00

One extra hour after the finish times shown on the following days:-New Years Day, Valentine's Day, Thursday before Good Friday, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Sunday, Easter Monday, Sunday and Monday of all Bank Holiday weekends.

St Patrick's Day, St George's Day, St David's Day, St Andrew's Day.  $23^{rd} - 30^{th}$  December inc New Years Eve – 36 hours as existing.

- 5 Confirmation that copies of the application form and supporting documentation have been served on the relevant authorities has been received.
- 6 Representations have been received from local residents and are attached to this report as appendix 2.
- Representations have also been received from the Directorate of the Urban Environment and are attached to this report as Appendix 3.
- This application falls within the Council's recent responsibility for liquor licensing which has a direct link to the Council's key corporate priority that safety matters.

#### **PROPOSAL**

That the Sub-Committee consider the application made by Ridgeway Licensing Services, in respect of The Crown, 12, Barrack Lane, Halesowen, West Midlands, to vary the premises licence.

### LAW

- The law relating to the granting of applications to vary premises licences is governed by the Licensing Act 2003, Section 11, Part 3 and Schedule 8, Part 1.
- Pursuant to Section 35(3)(a) of the Licensing Act 2003, where a relevant authority has made representations, the Licensing Authority must:-
  - Hold a hearing to consider item, unless the authority, the applicant and each person who has made such representations agree that a hearing is unnecessary, and

- Having regard to the representations, take such of steps mentioned in subsection (4) (if any) as it considers necessary for the promotion of the Licensing objectives.
- The steps are:-
- to modify the conditions of licence;
- to reject the whole or part of the application.
- Pursuant to Section 36(1) and (4) of the Licensing Act 2003 where an application (or any part of an application) is granted or rejected under Section 35 of the Licensing Act 2003, the Licensing Authority must immediately give notice to that effect to:-
  - the applicant;
  - any person who made relevant representations in respect of the application and
  - the Chief Officer of Police for the police area in which the premises are situated.
- In pursuance of Regulation 26(1) of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearing Regulations 2005), the Licensing Authority must make its determination at the conclusion of the hearing.
- 15 If the Licensing Authority refuse to grant the application to vary the premises licence, there is a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court pursuant to Schedule 5, Part 1(b).
- Pursuant to Section 4(1), (2) and (3), Schedule 5 of the Licensing Act 2003, where the Licensing Authority grant an application to vary a premises licence in whole or in part. The applicant may appeal against any decision to modify the conditions of the licence under subsection 4(a) of Section 35 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 17 Where a person who made relevant representations to the application desires to contend:-
  - that any variation made ought not to have been made, or
  - that, when varying the licence, the Licensing Authority ought not to have modified the conditions of the licence, or ought to have modified item in a different way, under subsection 4(a) of Section 35 of the Licensing Act.

They have the right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court.



The types of regulated entertainments proposed reinstate and then enhance the normal pub and family entertainments that were previously unregulated, with the benefit to enhance the local facilities for social entertainment and reduce the focus on alcohol.

No new steps have been identified in risk assessment in relation to the four licensing objectives except as detailed below.

#### b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Providing a 30-minute extension of opening hours after the end of the sale of alcohol will promote this objective as the last drink will be consumed less quickly, with access to the pub's toilet facilities Regular liaison with Police



### Application to vary a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003

An application was received by this Directorate on 24th November 2005.

This section of the Directorate has record of one complaint alleging noise problems since 1995. This was from a Karaoke type function on the 16th July 2005, The licensee stated that on that night he had been away from the pub and had left someone else in charge for the evening. Residential accommodation is directly adjacent to the public house.

I visited the premises by appointment on Friday 25th November 2005.

The interior of the Pub was undergoing refurbishment at the time of my visit.

This has involved the removal of the kitchen to the rear of the premises and the creation of a larger function room using that space.

None of the windows at the premises are double glazed. Only one of the windows was openable to the function room, and the licensee agreed to fit a window lock to the opening so that he had control if members of the public wanted to open the window in hot weather. A rear window had been bricked up to the rear of the room and information was given about ensuring that the gaps between the frame to the fire door and the external wall were filled with solid material with good acoustic properties.

The licensee stated that he was to monitor noise levels from the function room, and would consider fitting secondary glazing if he felt that noise levels were unsatisfactory. There was no noise limiting device fitted at the premises.

A new extract fan was in the process of being fitted to the rear function room, and advice was given to the licensee and the builder on site about the provision of an acoustic cover on the external outlet from the fan.

The builder on site stated that the electrical wiring to the function room was protected by a RCD trip switching.

I wish to make the following representations regarding the application:

- i) The windows of the public house are to remain closed when any form of entertainment is taking place within.
- ii) An acoustic cover is provided to the external fan opening to the function room.
- iii) The gaps around the frame to fire door to the function room are effectively sealed to prevent sound escape.
