#### **Background**

2 Select Committee on Community Safety Housing and Neighbourhood Nuisance Working Group

The Working Group met on 7<sup>th</sup> September, and received the following items

Update on developments regarding the use of mediation to resolve anti social behaviour and an update on dealing with tenants in breach of noise abatement orders

Mr O McMillan (Mediation Officer) presented an overview to the Working Group on how mediation could be of assistance in reducing conflict between parties involved in neighbourhood disputes.

In making the presentation, Mr McMillan advising Working Group members of what the Mediation service had to offer in terms of assistance in neighbourhood and family noise nuisance and mediation in family disputes to alleviate the risk of homelessness. The following was RESOLVED:

- That Mr McMillan invite Council Members to a meeting and for representatives from the Directorate of Housing, including representative from the Mediation Service, and inform them of the kind of assistance the Mediation Service can provide.
- That a further report on progress be submitted to the Working Group meeting to be held on 26<sup>th</sup> January 2005.

## Update on dealing with tenants in breach of noise abatement orders

Mr R Sims (Assistant Director Housing) updated the Working Group on progress regarding complaints of noise nuisance, and on the Council's actions once a complaint is received. He also explained the role of the "out-of-hours" team with regard to witnessing. A discussion regarding how to tackle car stereo noise was also discussed/.

The following was RESOLVED:

- That following consideration by The Cabinet, the Tenancy Conditions report be submitted to the meeting of the Select Committee on Community Safety on 9<sup>th</sup> November 2005 and for a representative from the Directorate of the Urban Environment also be invited to advise the Committee on the current view regarding noise emanating from car stereos.
- That the Working Group supported the work being undertaken by the "out of hours" team.

## <u>Select Committee on Community Safety Children and Young People</u> Working Group

The Working Group met on 13<sup>th</sup> September 2005 and received the following items

#### Survey of Young Peoples' Attitudes to Community Safety

Ms L Thompson of Dudley Youth Council presented the Working Group the feedback from the "Have a Say Day" initiative by outlining some of the items that young people had considered to be priorities for keeping young people safe in Dudley.

Following discussion by the Working Group, it was RESOLVED

 That Mr M Galikowski and Mr A Winning to prepare a report on publicity in respect of anti social behaviour order and submit it to the Working Group meeting to be held on 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2005.

- That a report on information gathered at the "Have a Say Day" be submitted to the next meeting of the Working Group on 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2005.
- That a cross-section of young people be invited to attend the Working Group Meeting on 1<sup>st</sup> December 2005, so that the Working Group could ascertain their views on "naming and shaming" people who are the subject of an anti social behaviour orders
- That Mr Mayou to liaise with Mr M Williams (Director of Finance) in respect of the joint consideration between representatives of the Select Committee on Education and Lifelong Learning on the report entitled "Information and Developments Relating to Exclusions, Attendance and Admissions and Children in Public Care" due to be presented to this Working Group to on 1st September 2005.

Mr D Lowndes (Assistant Director Culture and Leisure) presented a report advising the Working Group of the current position regarding the production of a local Cultural Strategy with specific reference to community safety issues and the following was RESOLVED
