APPENDIX 1

<u>Responses To Issues Raised at Previous Meeting held on 24th June 2009 and 23rd September 2009</u>

Petitions

a) Local residents presented a petition requesting that customers of the Savers Express Supermarket in Upper Gornal be allowed to park on double yellow lines in front of the shop for up to fifteen minutes.

The Petition was referred to the Director of the Urban Environment for consideration.

Following investigations, the Group Engineer, Traffic and Road Safety has written to the owner of the shop to advise that as parking in front of the shop would obstruct the public highway and prevent the movement of vehicular traffic, parking on the double yellow lines would not be possible for any length of time.

b) Local tenants presented a petition to the Committee meeting held on 24th June, 2009, objecting to the unkempt state of some void properties in Hartland Avenue, Coseley and to the adverse effect on surrounding elderly residents, on account of mini motor bikes gaining access to the fields at the back of the properties from the void properties. The petition was referred to the Director of Adult, Community and Housing Services, with a request that a report on the matter be submitted to the next meeting of the Committee. Local tenants complained.

The Director of Adult, Community and Housing Services investigated the issue and reported back to the Committee on 23rd September, 2009. Following consideration of the report, on the 23rd September, residents spoke with the Area Housing Team Manager regarding concerns which still existed. Following his discussion with local tenants, the Area Housing Team Manager has arranged for the situation to be closely monitored, with the Housing Manager making weekly site visits and speaking to the tenants who raised the concerns on the evening of North Dudley Area Committee meeting. The Area Housing Manager advises that no major problems have occurred since the last meeting of the North Dudley Area Committee.
