Standards Report - Performance Data

Purpose of Report

1. To present the latest data available on the performance of schools in the Borough.

All data presented in this report is the most recent available.

Background

Early Years Foundation Stage

2. The Early Years Foundation Stage Profile is an assessment which is reported at the end of the Reception year. The profile captures the six areas of learning of the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum as a set of 13 assessment scales.

Personal, social and emotional development (PSED)	3 assessment scales
Communication, language and literacy (CLL)	4 assessment scales
Problem solving, reasoning and numeracy (PSRN)	3 assessment scales
Knowledge and understanding of the World (KUW)	1 assessment scale
Physical development (PD)	1 assessment scale
Creative development (CD)	1 assessment scale

At the request of the Borough's schools, an Early Years Foundation Stage Profile mean was calculated for each school and for Dudley as a whole.

Analysis of 2011 Early Years Foundation Stage Profile results:

Local Authority Performance Indicator Areas:

Good level of development

4. When a child scores at least 78 points across the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile with a minimum of 6 points across all Personal, social and emotional development and Communication, language and literacy scales, this is deemed to be a 'good level of development'.

In 2010, 52.2% of Dudley children achieved this. In 2011 the figure increased by 2.3ppts to 54.5%.

Dudley is 5 percentage points (ppts) below national average for a 'good level of development' but there has been greater improvement than nationally over three years; 11 ppts in Dudley compared to 7 ppts nationally.

For this measure, Dudley is ranked 11th out of the 14 West Midlands local authorities.

Score of at least 78 points across Early Years Foundation Stage Profile

Following a 7 ppt increase in the number of pupils achieving at least 78 points across the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile in 2010, there was a further increase of 2 ppts in 2011.

6+ points in all Communication, Language and Literacy (CLL) scales

Dudley results are up by 2 ppts to 57%, this is 5 ppts below national average at 62%. Over 3 years Dudley 6+ results for Communication, Language and Literacy have improved by 10 ppts compared to 7 nationally.

6+ points in all Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED) scales

Dudley is 1 ppt below national average at 78% but has improved by 2 ppts in line with national improvement.

Over three years, Dudley Personal, Social and Emotional Development results have improved by 11 ppts compared to 5 ppts nationally.

5. Narrowing the achievement gap (between the LA 20% lowest performing group and all pupils)

The Statistical First Release (SFR) in November 2011, shows that the narrowing the gap outcome for Dudley at 31.4% is in-line with the national figure and is a further narrowing of the gap of 0.6ppts.

Dudley is ranked 7th out of the 14 West Midlands authorities for narrowing the gap.

6. The gender gap

Girls %6+ results have improved in all areas by between 0.1 and 2.1ppts except for in physical development, which is in line with 2010.

Boys %6+ results have improved considerably in all areas by between 0.4 and 6.8ppts. The areas of personal, social and emotional development, problem solving, reasoning and numeracy, knowledge and understanding of the world and creative development have the largest increases.

The gender gap between boys and girls 6+ attainment has also further narrowed with decreases in all areas. In problem solving, reasoning and numeracy and knowledge an understanding the gap has decreased by over 3ppts. In creative development (CD) in 2010 there was a 21.2% difference

between boys and girls achievement, in 2011 this difference has reduced by 5.7 to 15.5%

Boys % 6+ results in Dudley remain significantly lower than girls across the three Personal, social and emotional development scales (PSED) (12.6 less), Communication, language and literacy (CLL) (21.2 less), Personal, social and emotional development (PSED)/(CLL) Communication, language and literacy combined (20.8 less) and Creative Development (CD) (15.5 less)

This is mirrored nationally with boys results lower than girls across all scales and significantly lower in Personal, social and emotional development (PSED), Communication, language and literacy (CLL) (particularly writing) and Creative development (CD).

7. Early Years Foundation Stage Profile outcomes across all scales

In 2011, 10/13 scales of the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile have shown improvement for the percentage of children attaining 6+ points. Of the remaining three scales, two are in-line with last year (DA and NLC) and one scale is slightly lower (LCT) than the 2010 results.

The outcomes for two out of three PSRN scales have shown improvement: Calculating (+1) and Shape, Space and Measures (+2). The largest increases were in Emotional Development (+3) and Creative Development (+4).

- 8. The assessment scales with the highest percentage of children in 2011 working securely within the Early Learning Goals were: Physical Development 92% (national 91%) and Dispositions and Attitudes (PSED scale) 91% (in-line with national). The assessment scale with the lowest percentage of children working securely within the Early Learning Goals was: Writing 62% (national 67%) Writing remains a priority area for Dudley although scores have improved by 8 ppts over two years compared to 5 ppts nationally.
- 9. Since 2009, there has been an increase in the percentage of children in Dudley working securely within the Early Learning Goals across all scales. The largest increases were 11 ppts for Knowledge and Understanding of the World (KU) and 10 ppts in 3 scales; Linking Sounds and Letters; Calculating and Creative Development. The increases in Dudley are greater than nationally in all 13 scales.

10. Areas for Development 2011-12

To increase the number of children achieving 6+ outcomes in Personal, Social and Emotional Development and also Communication, Language and Literacy. To close the gap between the least well- performing children and the rest.

To further increase the number of children in Dudley borough achieving a 'good level of development'. This is measured as scoring at least 78 points on the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile (EYFSP), including all Personal, Social and Emotional Development and Communication, Language and Literacy scales.

To further close the achievement gap between the lowest performing group of children (as measured in the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile) and the rest.

13. Initial Analysis Key Stage 1 - 2011

Key Stage 1 Assessment

At the end of Key Stage 1 in 2011, results in each of the subjects were based upon teacher assessment of children's attainment. The tasks and test were used as part of the overall picture of children's attainment, but these results were not collected as part of the statutory data return to the DfE.

There is an improvement in Key Stage 1 results in all areas.

In Mathematics at Level 2+, Dudley improved by +0.9ppt, whereas the national result improved by +1.0pp. This puts Dudley -0.1pp below national results. At Level 2b+ Dudley improved by +2.3ppts and by +0.7 at Level 3 in Mathematics, and the national result improved by +1.0ppt at Level 2b+ and there was no change in the national result at Level 3.

Girls now outperform boys in all areas at Level 2+ at Key Stage 1. However, boys out-perform girls at L3 in Mathematics and Science.

Boys improved on 2010 results in Reading, Writing and Mathematics at Level 2+ and 2b+ and Level 3 Reading but declined slightly (-0.2 and -1) in Level 3 Writing and Mathematics.

Girls improved at all levels except Level 3 Mathematics.

Two Dudley schools, Pedmore and St Joseph's RC Stourbridge featured in the top 100 state schools for attainment (English and maths scores) for 2011.

14. Reading

Key Stage 1 standards in Reading increased by 1.4% at Level 2+. Both girls and boys improved.

15. Writing

Standards in Writing at the end of Key Stage 1 at Level 2+ rose by 0.9 ppt. Boys' performance improved by over 1.3 ppt and girls' performance improved by 1.6 ppt. Despite boys' improvement, girls still significantly out-perform the boys.

18. Initial Analysis Key Stage 2 - 2011

In 2010, only 32 schools participated in the national tests due to industrial action by headteachers. This was not a statistically valid sample of schools across Dudley and year-on-year comparisons of test results were not possible. Analysis in the standards report in 2010 was done with Teacher Assessment (TA) data.

In this 2011 report SAT data from 2009 has been used as a comparison with 2010 TA data in red.

19. Analysis on SATs Data in 2011 (comparison with 2009 SAT data)

Attainment in English increased by 2 ppt to 82.2% at Level 4+, and is in line with the national result.

Attainment at Level 5 in English decreased by 2 ppts to 26.9%, with the national level at 29%.

Reading has declined by 1 ppt to 84% at Level 4+. At Level 5 it has declined by 7ppts to 38%.

Writing at Level 4+ increased by 10ppts from 2009 to 77 %. Level 5 has remained stable at 20%.

Girls at Level 4+ continue to out-perform boys in English (12 ppts). Similarly, they out-perform boys in Reading by 9 ppts and in Writing by 13 ppts. Boys however have improved by 10ppts at L4+ in writing on the 2009 SATs (as did girls).

Girls have also for the first time outperformed boys in Mathematics at L4+ by 1ppt.

At Level 5+ in English, girls out-perform boys by 10 ppts, in Reading by 10 ppts and in Writing by 9. However, in Mathematics at L5, boys continue to out-perform girls by 4 ppts.

Attainment in Mathematics has remained the same as in 2009 at Level 4+ (79%) and puts Dudley below the 2011 national results. Standards at Level 5 decreased by 3.5 ppts to 30%, putting us 5 ppts below the national picture.

20. Progress over KS2

Analysis shows there is an issue with progress in mathematics over KS2 as 58% of primary schools had progress data below the national level for 2010 (86%) with 36% of these below 80%, and 17% below 70%. In English 35% of primary schools were below the national 2010 level of 87% but only 5% of these were below 70%. The Every Child a Writer (ECAW) programme in 20 schools will have supported the improvements in Writing and therefore English overall.

Areas for Development 2011-12

Key Stage 1

Improving the percentage of pupils achieving level 3 (above the national expectation levels for seven year olds).

Key Stage 2

- Progress across KS1-2 in mathematics especially.
- Addressing performance gaps, working with schools to improve pupil achievement general but focussing work on groups of pupils in each school who are not making expected progress.
- Improving the percentage of pupils achieving level 5 (above the national expectation levels for eleven year olds).

Initial Analysis Key Stage 4 2011

This analysis of confirmed data (26th January) celebrates another year of improvement in the number of pupils attaining 5A*-C grades and those achieving 5A*-C including English and mathematics.

Collectively, Dudley Local Authority records 59% 5A*-C including English and mathematics, 2 percentage points up on that achieved in 2010 and 81% 5A*-C, 5 percentage points up on that achieved in 2010.

(See attached spreadsheet of standards, and distance from targets, over time)

(a) 5A*-C including English and Mathematics

Eleven schools have maintained or improved on that achieved in 2010, Eight schools have reported a result on 60% or above and no school reported results below the floor target of 35%.

Six schools have maintained year-on-year improvement since 2008. Wordsley has made the most significant improvement from 25% in 2008 (below the 30% floor at that time) to 50% in 2011 and Ellowes Hall making significant improvement from 52% in 2008 to 76% in 2011. Both these schools recently featured in the top one hundred most improved schools nationally.

(a) Dudley / National Comparison

The Dudley 5A*-C including English and Maths figure of 59% equals that achieved by all schools nationally, and is 1pp above that achieved by state funded schools (58%).

Areas for Development 2011-12

 The school improvement team has recently become a Traded Service providing bespoke in-school support and advice that meets the immediate needs of the schools. The support is still firmly embedded in activities that

- promote best practice and key messages that give positive direction with the express aim to continue to improve standards and progress in individual schools and for the Local Authority.
- The team also provides focused support to three schools that require School Improvement Team intervention. These schools are Thorns CC, Leasowes High and The Coseley School.
- The team continues to focus improvement in English and the sciences, from consultants within the team, for both CPD and bespoke support to schools. For mathematics, in the absence of a resident maths consultant, we are buying in support from our nearest shire counties to support the mathematics training programme at Saltwells. The LA is brokering school to school support for mathematics where requested.
- Behaviour support to schools is developing to meet the needs identified by the schools and to begin to meet the demands of the White Paper and new Education Act.

Comparative data for A level results is based upon points. The table on the next page explains the points score. In essence the higher the grade a candidate achieves the more points they accrue.

The benchmark data in table 15 uses this methodology to calculate the average point scores for all candidates taking A levels in Dudley Schools and compares this figure with statistical geographical neighbours.

Dudley school sixth forms vary considerably in size and this needs to be bourne in mind when using the data. Clearly, the smaller the sixth form the greater the impact each student's results have on the average score recorded.
