- 1.1 To inform the Committee of the written responses made to questions asked at the previous meeting.

- 2.3 A resident commented in relation to the feasibility study that was due to be undertaken in respect of car parking and it was requested that the study should commence urgently and, whilst undertaking the study, consideration should also be given to the lack of short term parking. The Head of Policy (Executive and Support) advised that the matter was being treated as a high priority and comments made have been passed to the Team Manager/Parking Management who has confirmed that the viability of shorter duration tariffs are being explored.
