Members' Planning Code of Good Practice

Purpose of Report

1. To consider amendments to the Members' Planning Code of Good Practice.

Background

- 2. At its meeting on the 24th July 2006 the Council approved a recommendation of the Standards Committee with regard to the adoption of the Members' Planning Code of Good Practice.
- 3. As a result of the new Members' Code of Conduct approved in July 2007 a number of consequential amendments to the Planning Code of Good Practice are required. A copy of the Planning Code of Good Practice indicating the consequential amendments is attached at Appendix 1. The revised draft also includes a number of changes recommended by officers by way of clarification or to emphasise the importance of a particular issue.
- 4. The Standards Committee is asked to consider the amendments and recommend a revised Planning Code of Good Practice to the Development Control Committee and Council.

Finance

5. There are no financial implications arising from this report.

<u>Law</u>

- 6. Section III of the Local Government Act 1972 enables the Council to do any thing which is calculated to facilitate or is conducive or incidental to the discharge of the Council's functions as local planning authority.
- 7. The Members' Planning Code of Good Practice is included in the Constitution.

Recommendation
