REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR OF THE URBAN ENVIRONMENT

MANOR ABBEY ROAD TRAFFIC CALMING SCHEME – IMPACT ON PRIORY ROAD

1.0 PURPOSE

1.1 To provide an interim report on the on-going monitoring exercise currently being carried out following the introduction of traffic calming measures along Manor Abbey Road, Halesowen.

2.0 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 At its meeting on the 10th July 2001, this Area Committee endorsed proposals for the introduction of a traffic calming scheme along Manor Abbey Road, Halesowen, which was subsequently implemented in July 2002.
- 2.2 These works, which are shown on the attached Drawing No. TM1497/5, were undertaken with funding from the Area Committee's Delegated Capital Budget but, in line with all similar schemes of this nature, a monitoring exercise to assess the effectiveness of the measures

was also put into place in order to compare the 'before' and 'after' position in relation to the volume and speed of traffic travelling along both Manor Abbey Road and the nearby Priory Road. This latter road being identified as a potential alternative rat-run for drivers who may wish to avoid the traffic calming measures along Manor Abbey Road.

- 2.3 The issue of Priory Road being used as a rat run has also been raised more recently during the 'Open Forum' section of this Committee's last meeting on the 22nd.October 2003, by Mr. Paul Figures, a representative of the Lapal Primary School. A meeting on site was, therefore, duly arranged with Mr. Figures on the 10th November 2003 in order to discuss the concerns being raised and explain the current traffic position, which is now outlined in this report.
- 2.4 Whilst it is normal practice for monitoring exercises associated with traffic calming schemes to be carried out for a 3 year period following the implementation of the measures, it is sometimes helpful to review the situation at periodic intervals and Appendices A and B attached to this report, therefore, summarize the findings of the data currently available.
- 2.5 However, in summary, the data currently available from the monitoring exercise indicates that whilst the traffic calming measures introduced along Manor Abbey Road have already achieved a degree of success in reducing both the speed and volume of traffic using that road, this has not led to any significant increases in the level of rat-running traffic along the nearby Priory Road.
- 2.6 Indeed, from an objective position, the speed of traffic along Priory Road still remains within the range that is generally deemed acceptable for a 30mph speed limit and the increase in traffic flows, which effectively

represents approximately one third of the decrease along Manor Abbey Road, still reflects a relatively low overall volume of traffic using Priory Road.

3.0 PROPOSALS

3.1 That the Area Committee notes both the encouraging results of the monitoring data currently available and also that no further complementary traffic calming measures are considered necessary.

4.0 FINANCE

4.1 There are no financial implications arising directly from this report.

5.0LAW

- 5.1 The Traffic Calming Act 1992 amends the Highways Act 1980 to allow works to be carried out to promote safety and to preserve or improve the environment.
- 5.2 Section 111 of the Local Government Act 1972 empowers the Council to do anything that is calculated to facilitate or is conducive or incidental to the discharge of any of its functions.

6.0 EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES

6.1 The proposals contained within this report comply with the Council's Equal Opportunities Policy.

7.0 RECOMMENDATION
