#### **Notice of Temporary Events**

#### **Purpose of Report**

1. To consider the Notice made by Mr Ansar Farakh for temporary events in respect of 99 High Street, Stourbridge.

### **Background**

- 2. On the 24<sup>th</sup> July, 2006 Notices were received from Challinors, Solicitors on behalf of Mr Ansar Farakh for premises 99 High Street, Stourbridge for Temporary Events on 3/4/5/6, 10/11/12/13 and 17/18/19/20 August 2006. Copies of the applications are attached as Appendix 1 to this report.
- 3. The applications had the following documents attached
  - Correct fee £63.00
  - Letter dated 24<sup>th</sup> July, 2006 to the West Midlands Police.
- 4. The applications for temporary events are as follows:-

To allow the retail sale of hot food on

Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup>, Friday 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> August, 2006. Thursday 10<sup>th</sup>, Friday 11<sup>th</sup>, Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> August 2006. Thursday 17<sup>th</sup>, Friday 18<sup>th</sup>, Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> August, 2006.

Between the hours of 23.00 and 03.00

- 5. The notice for the 3<sup>rd</sup> July, 2006 is invalid because the Notice was not served within the mandatory 10 days by virtue of the provisions contained within, part 5 of the Licensing Act 2003, Section 100(7).
- 6. On the 24<sup>th</sup> July, 2006 the Licensing Office received a notice of police objections to the applications based on the prevention of crime and disorder. A copy of that notice is attached at Appendix 2.
- 7. This application falls within the Council's recent responsibility for liquor licensing which has a direct link to the Council's key corporate priority that safety matters.
