#### Amendments to the Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003

#### **Purpose of Report**

1. To inform the Committee of the amendments made to the Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003.

#### **Background**

- 2. On the 28<sup>th</sup> January 2010, the Department for Culture, Media and Sport issued amendments to the Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003.
- 3. Section 8 of the Guidance, which deals with applications for premises licences has amended Elected Members roles when acting as an interested party in relation to making representations to an application/variation of a premises licence.
- 4. Currently Local Councillors can make representations in writing and at a hearing on behalf of an interested party such as a resident or local business if specifically requested to do so. They can also make representations as an interested party in their own right if they live or are involved in a business in the vicinity of the premises in question.
- 5. The Guidance has been amended as follows:-
  - 'Local Councillors can also as Elected Members of the Licensing Authority make representations in their own right if they have concerns about any premises, regardless of whether they live or run a business in the vicinity of those premises. For example, Councillors may apply for a review of a licence if problems at a specific premises which justify intervention are brought to their attention'. These actions are of course subject to the Local Authorities (Model Code of Conduct) Order 2007.
- 6. This information falls within the Council's recent responsibility for liquor licensing, which as a direct link to the Council's key corporate priority that safety matters.
