Petitions

A petition was submitted by Councillor Stanley on behalf of residents of the Stickley Estate requesting the reinstatement of the 297/297A bus service around the Stickley Estate was referred to Centro for consideration. The Area Operations Manager – Black Country National Express has written to the Chairman of the Committee advising that it was unlikely that the 297 bus route would be extended through the Lower Gornal Area, following an analysis of the level of demand for the route. He also advised that Lower the Gornal area would benefit from revised timings on the 297 route to improve connections with route 257 from Dudley.

The Area Operations Manager – Black Country National Express also informed that residents have access to the "Ring and Ride" service which is also funded by Centro and aimed at giving elderly and infirm residents the freedom to get around independently.
