A Graduated Approach

The SEN Code of Practice recommends that schools and LA's should provide a graduated response to children with SEN. It suggests gradually increasing interventions into teaching and curriculum referred to as School Action and School Action Plus before embarking on the statutory assessment and statementing procedures.

School Action

The school will plan a programme of teaching and learning to meet the child's individual needs. The person responsible for doing this is usually the school's Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator (SENCO), who will work closely with the class teacher.

School Action Plus

If the child continues to make little or no progress over a reasonable period of time, the school may decide that additional specialist help is needed. The school may need to seek further advice and support from specialist services outside the school. This is called School Action Plus.

The advice will depend upon the needs of the child, but may involve:

- Educational Psychologists
- Specialist Advisory Teachers
- Behavioural Support Staff
- Health professionals

The professionals may suggest particular teaching methods or behaviour management styles. They can advise on special resource materials, access needs, adaptations and specialist equipment.

Statutory Assessment

The LA considers the need for a statutory assessment and, if appropriate makes a multi-disciplinary assessment. If the assessment determines the child's needs cannot reasonably be provided by mainstream school from its own resources, the LA makes a statement and arranges monitors and reviews the provision named within it.

Statemented monies

Statemented monies are delegated to schools at the beginning of the financial year and adjusted in September. An SEN audit is conducted on 31st January and 31st August and any pupils with a substantive statement on that date receive funding for the hours specified on his/her statement.

Consultation on proposals to close Cradley High School

What is the proposal?

The proposal is to close Cradley High School with effect from 31 August 2008.

- Pupils in Year 11 at Cradley will leave as normal by 31 August 2007
- Pupils in Year 10 will continue at Cradley and leave by 31 August 2008
- All pupils in Years 7, 8 and 9 will transfer to other secondary schools by 1 September 2007.
- · Every effort will be made to accommodate parent preferences
- No admission to Year 7 in September 2007
- The leisure facilities will continue subject to confirmation of management and financial arrangements

Why is Cradley High School proposed for closure?

The number of babies born in Dudley has fallen by nearly 20% so there are fewer children to go to school. The money to pay for schools is based on the number of children and so Dudley gets less money from central government. 600 fewer children this year means £2million less to allocate to schools. Cradley High School will receive less money because there is less available for all schools.

Cradley High School will also get less money because fewer children want to go there. Only 114 (33%) of the 345 secondary aged pupils living in the immediate area attended Cradley High. Only 56 pupils started in Year 7 and the number has fallen every year for the last five years. Cradley High is the smallest secondary school in Dudley and 30% of the 750 pupil places are unfilled. Money is wasted in paying for empty places.

What will happen if no action is taken?

Cradley High spends 83% of the school budget on staff, 7% on premises and 10% on supplies and services. The school budget for 2007/8 will be calculated on about 80 pupils less than 2006/7 reducing the money available by over £200k. Less money means cuts in staffing and other areas which will result in

- Lower standards achieved by pupils
- Increased class sizes and possibly mixed age teaching
- o Fewer staff to carry out leadership and management roles
- Fewer opportunities for extended provision
- More limited opportunities for professional development
- Increased workload for staff

The standards of achievement at Cradley High have improved over several years and the 2006 GCSE results were commendable. The school will not be able to sustain these standards as budgets fall and staffing reduces.

Why are other secondary schools not included?

Each year there are fewer primary children transferring to secondary schools which is reflected in the number of applications. Cradley is the only school

with admissions below 120 and is no longer sustainable. Consultation on Investing in the Future – Transforming Secondary Education involves all secondary schools including Cradley High in shaping a vision for the future. This will not translate into any proposals for other schools for a number of years and any proposals would be subject to securing funding from Building Schools for the Future. Cradley is not sustainable now. We are taking action to ensure that Cradley High pupils have access to higher quality education at schools of sustainable size.

What about alternative secondary schools?

It is expected that 245 pupils (56 x Y7, 91 x Y8, 98 x Y9) will transfer to alternative schools by 1 September 2007. There are sufficient places to accommodate all pupils in Dudley secondary schools. Discussions are taking place with schools about how the transfer arrangements might work best and further information will be provided for parents over the next few months. Parents have not yet been asked for preferences but support for parents and pupils will be provided at that stage. Standards in Dudley secondary schools have risen steadily over the last few years and parents may be assured that all alternative secondary schools offer a sustainable quality of education. All OFSTED reports are on the website.

What about support for pupils with ethnic minority backgrounds? About 20% of Cradley pupils are recorded as learning English as an additional language. Where appropriate some of these pupils are supported by the Council's Ethic Minority Achievement Service. Every Dudley secondary school has pupils in this category. Cradley pupils would continue to receive additional support as they transfer to alternative secondary schools. It is not in the interests of any community to be served by a school which is not financially viable. Standards of provision for all children and particularly these groups will be improved by attending schools with a higher level of resources.

What about the community?

Cradley High is used by a range of groups for sport and other leisure activities. Discussions will take place about how community use can continue if the proposal to close the school is approved. Agreement will need to be reached on the management of the facilities and how they will be paid for.

What happens next?

There are legal processes for making changes to schools that we have to follow. There are five basic stages

- Consultation which is where we are now. We will take note of everything that people say to us at meetings or letter or email. Every response will be carefully considered including any alternative proposals. We will report to the Cabinet Member with recommendations.
- 2. **Publication** of statutory notices. These are legal documents that set out clearly what the proposals are. The publication stage only lasts for one day which we would aim to publish before the end of October.

- 3. **Representation** starts immediately after publication. There are 6 weeks for people to make representations against the proposals. This would end in December.
- 4. **Decision**. If any representations are made against the proposals the decision will be made by School Organisation Committee. A decision would be expected in January 2007. If the matter is referred to the Schools Adjudicator the decision would be delayed until March or April February 2007.
- 5. Implementation cannot until a decision is made but we can start preparing by working with staff, governors and parents on all the things that would need to be done if the decision to close the school is taken.

How do I need to respond?

Responses should be made by 5.00 p.m. on Thursday 28th September to the address in the consultation document.
