14 MONITORING OF THE MEMBERS' CODE OF CONDUCT

The report summarised the nature and outcome of the four cases referred to the Standards Board during that period. The report also contained information from the Monitoring Officer on guidance and training issues and proposals of that Officer regarding further training.

In reply to a question, he also clarified the position on the Code of Conduct in relation to the role of a member of the Development Control Committee.

The point was made by one member that a thorough investigation of the facts ought to be made by a member of the Council reporting a matter before a referral to the Standards Board was made.
