Police and Communities Together

<u>Subject</u> Action/Response

Crime figures Multiple incidents involving small number of perpetrators.

No specific ward area is being targeted.

Crime targeted at the elderly and commercial vehicles.

Question was tabled regarding the accuracy of the reported figures and how the crimes are being categorised. PC

Lewis addressed this question.

The public were urged to continue to report crimes.

Information on break-ins

'Lock snapping'

PC Lewis shared information on 'lock snapping' trends and

answered questions regarding suitable 'anti- snapping'

locks.

Security cameras/ASB Confirmed that the security camera in the precinct are

working and will be scrutinised if an incident is reported.
Re: ASB incidents- John Jones the anti-social behaviour officer is an effective contact should members of the public

have concerns.

Crime Priorities-ASB Dudley Safe and Sound Community Partnership has an

opportunity for residents to ask questions about how the partnership tackles crime and disorder, including ASB. Residents were encouraged to attend the public board meeting on October 30th 2017 and raise ASB as a priority and how it is being addressed. Discussions at this forum should be shared with MP's and recommendations made

to the Police and Crime Commissioner.

Change to GP surgery hour opening times

The opening hours for surgeries have changed and patients may be asked to attend another surgery. Why is this being done?

Surgeries in the ward are under pressure to offer longer opening hours. Extended hours are available at surgeries across the wards for non-emergency cases- 'out of hours'. Therefore patients may be asked to attend another surgery in this instance.

Railings outside Redhall School

Question about why the railing haven't been repaired. This is a specialised job and has been put out to tender; a response is awaited.

Sainsbury's in Gornal village

Dropped curbs have been fitted but cars are still parking across this area. It was suggested that road marking may stop people from parking.

Vale Street scheme

A letter from Alun Lunt was read with information about an 'outline scheme' that is acceptable for Highways officers, Planners (in principle) and Conservation officers. The work is likely to begin in early Spring 2018.

There was a discussion about the detail of the project and potential additions.

Cllr Stanley proposed that this outline scheme be accepted. This was agreed.
