



- The AWP machines must be located on these licensed premises and there must be a bar for serving alcohol to customers on the premises. The bar must be one at which alcohol can be served without a requirement that food must accompany the alcohol.
- The Permit holder must also be the Premises Licence holder i.e. the person holding a Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 5. Section 34 (5E) of the Gaming Act 1968 provides for two types of gaming machines which are:
- (i) Amusement with Prizes "coin or token" machines (Section 34(2),(3) and (5) Gaming Act 1968). These are the lower value machines; and
- (ii) Amusement with Prizes "all cash" machines (Section 34(5B) and (5C). These are the higher value machines.

The holder of a section 34(5E) permit may use either type of machine. The permit is for the total number of machines and therefore enables any combination of either type to be utilised up to the maximum number licensed.

- Permits are not transferable, and will cease to have effect if the Premises Licence to which they are linked, is transferred (Schedule 9, paragraph 20 of the Gaming Act 1968).
- The machines must only be made available for use at times when the premises is licensed to sell alcohol (Schedule 9 of the Gaming Act 1968 as amended by Schedule 16, paragraph 3(8) of the Gaming Act 2005).
