### **BACKGROUND AND CONTEXT**

- Provides a long term vision for economic regeneration in the Borough
- Revised for 2007/08 to include new developments
- Underpins the Dudley Community Strategy Creating a Prosperous Borough priority and Dudley Council Plan – Regeneration theme
- Supports the work of the Economic Development & Regeneration Partnership (EDRP)
- Recognises the importance of partnership and agency working to deliver the strategy
- Consultation process underway

### **KEY FACTS & FIGURES**

- Productivity gap is increasing £2.8bn in Black Country Gross Value Added (GVA) Dudley/Sandwell (2003) - £13,488 – lowest in Region
- Average Full Time Gross Weekly Earnings (Annual Survey of Hours & Earnings, 2006) £360.90 - lowest weekly average in West Midlands (workplace)
- Unemployment (Office for National Statistics) 3.6%, 6,626 claimants (JSA Claimant Count, Nov 2006) 16.2%, 29,920 claimants (Overall Benefits Claim Rate, May 2006)
- Skills Gap (Annual Population Survey) 16% of residents of working age without qualifications 20.8% of working age population with Level 4 qualification, compared to 26% for England
- Restructuring of local economic base continues (Annual Business Inquiry, 2004)
   Manufacturing decrease - 16.8% of employment
   Service sector increase – over 70% of employment



### **KEY CHALLENGES**

- Raising productivity/GVA (Gross Value Added)
- Increase earnings levels
- Reducing unemployment/economic inactivity
- Increasing skills levels
- Diversifying structure of economy

### **STRATEGIC AIMS**

- 2. To support and develop new and existing businesses and to attract inward investment to the Borough
- 3. To encourage and support the development of a diverse and dynamic business base that increases the proportion of well paid jobs across the Borough
- 4. To improve the economic and environmental infrastructure of Dudley Borough and its town centres
- 5. To champion the interests and assets of Dudley Borough, securing additional resources and improving its position regionally, nationally and internationally



Aim 1 - To optimise the opportunities for local people – including the most vulnerable people and those from deprived areas - to obtain local jobs

- Addressing the training and employment needs of residents particularly in the Borough's most deprived areas, making the most of local employment opportunities.
- Maximising the benefits of working in partnership, to support the Local Jobs for Local People agenda.
- Promoting social inclusion



Aim 2 - To support and develop new and existing businesses and to attract inward investment to the Borough

- Maintaining a balanced supply of industrial land and premises
- Providing a package of support to businesses on key industrial estates through the Dudley & Sandwell Business Parks Network
- Supporting new and existing businesses through a range of business support programmes and initiatives



Aim 3 - To encourage and support the development of a diverse and dynamic business base that increases the proportion of well paid jobs across the Borough

Aim 4 - To improve the economic and environmental infrastructure of Dudley Borough and its town centres

- Maximising the potential of the Borough's major development sites
- Promoting the regeneration of the Borough's Town Centres
- Promoting the regeneration of the Borough's District and Local Centres
- Developing the Borough's Visitor Economy
- Providing a comprehensive public transport system in the Major Urban Areas and ensuring the expeditious movement of traffic within the Borough

Aim 5 - To champion the interests and assets of Dudley Borough, securing additional resources and improving its position regionally, nationally and internationally

- Supporting the development of a comprehensive spatial strategy for the Borough
- Maximising resources and funding opportunities to support economic regeneration activities
- Raising the profile of Dudley Borough regionally, nationally and internationally



### SOME KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- 170 people accessing employment through Jobs Plus in Brierley Hill (since June 2003)
- 57 jobs achieved through the local jobs brokerage programme (Adult & Community Learning Team)
- Savoy Centre officially opened 23 residents have entered employment
- 1795 adults have participated in family learning programmes through the Family Learning Network
- 6 Children's Centres operational in the borough
- 76 new business start-ups supported in the Black Country through the Prince's Trust
- Business support provided to over 1900 businesses and over 1000 individuals in the borough receiving new business start-up support through Business Link Black Country
- Cavendish Quarter opportunity site selected by English Partnerships for National Brownfield Land Pilot Study (£4.53m)
- Final government approval for the Brierley Hill Sustainable Access Network (£20.32m)
- £5.35m AWM funding approved for Castle Hill development
- Halesowen town centre clearance of CPO process with guaranteed start date
- Since April 2003, over £27m of external funding secured to support economic regeneration. A further £11m identified in the Regeneration Zone Implementation Plan

- Development of financial model to deliver the developments in Dudley town centre and secure funding to establish the Dudley Town Centre Regeneration Partnership
- Feasibility study for Business Improvement District for Stourbridge Town Centre
- Submission of bid to AWM to extend the scope of the Brierley Hill Sustainable Access
  Network
- Employment Heart development of an innovation campus around the area of the Dudley southern by-pass
- Support for the development of the Glasshouse Project Ruskin Mill Education Trust
- Implement the Lye District Action Plan and complete regeneration plans for Shell Corner, Cradley, Quarry Bank and Pensnett
- Support the development of the Black Country People's Millions bid to the Big Lottery Fund
- Submit Stage 2 Townscape Heritage Initiative bid
- The Prince's Trust Get Into Insurance pilot sector specific pilot programme
- Deliver contact and support programme for Dudley companies identified on the Black Country FTSE 150 companies list
- Follow up work following feasibility study for the Transport Innovation Fund
- Establish a Black Country Olympics Business Club Black Country Chamber
- Progression of the City Region agenda
