Report of the Area Liaison Officer

CAPITAL ALLOCATIONS

Purpose of Report

1. To consider the recommendations of the Capital Allocations Working Group with regard to allocations from within the Committee's capital budget for the financial year 2005/2006.

Background

- 2. The Capital Allocations Working Group met on 15 November 2005 and considered 4 new applications, 2 deferred applications and one presented for re-consideration.
- 3. They also considered the request of the Area Committee to re-consider the general policy of grant amounts.
- 4. The Chair of the Area Committee plus Members representing Castle & Priory; Quarry Bank and Dudley Wood and St James's Wards were present.
- 5. The Working Group agreed that in the absence of a Member representing St Thomas's Ward, recommendations on applications for that Ward, could be delegated to the Area Liaison Officer and the Ward Members. Consequently a meeting was held on 12 December 2005 between Councillor J. Davies representing St Thomas's and Mr J. Boyle representing the Area Liaison Officer.
- 6. The recommendations that the Working Group are making to the Area Committee are detailed in Appendix 1.

Finance

- 6. The recommendations made by the Working Group would result in a total expenditure of £ 20,960.00. This will leave a total of £57,539.30 to be available for further grant awards during this financial year.
- 7. However, because each of the 5 Wards has its own allocation to spend, the remainder per Ward is:

Castle & Priory = £15, 530.43Netherton, Woodside & St Andrew's = £7, 400.59Quarry Bank and Dudley Wood = £13, 249.43St James's = £12, 856.85St Thomas's = £8, 502.00

Law
