Background

Early Years Foundation Stage

 2009 was the seventh year of the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile, an assessment which is reported at the end of the Reception year. The profile captures the six areas of learning of the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum as a set of 13 assessment scales.

Personal, social and emotional development (PSED)

Communication, language and literacy (CLL)

Mathematical development (MD)

Knowledge and understanding of the World (KUW)

Physical development (PD)

At the request of the Borough's schools, an Early Years Foundation Stage Profile mean was calculated for each school and for Dudley as a whole.

However, national statistics are now available based upon the percentage of children attaining six points or more in each of the assessment scales of the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile. Children who achieve a scale score of six points or more are classified as working securely within the Early Learning Goals of the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum. There are no school level performance tables for this key stage.

Whilst performance in all aspects of the Early Years remains low compared to our statistical neighbours there has been rapid progress made in all 6 key areas. Dudley's figures improved upon last year. In some areas Dudley's rate of improvement was in the top 15% of Local Authorities nationally. For example, improvement in narrowing the gap between children from the most deprived areas compared to their peers, Dudley's improvement was the sixth highest nationally. In Communication, Language and literacy, Dudley's rate of improvement was 15th highest nationally.

Areas for development 2010/11

- 1. To increase the numbers of children achieving 6+ outcomes in PSED and CLL.
- 2. To close the gap between least well performing children and the rest.

4. Key Stage 2 assessments for Year 6 children took place in May 2009. The following data is the latest available to the Local Authority. Five measures are used for comparison: the overall percentage of children gaining the expected level of Level 4 and above in each subject, the percentage of pupils gaining Level 4+ in English and mathematics combined, the average points score, the sum of the test percentages and the overall contextual value added score.

In 2009, results at Level 4+ in mathematics and science remained at 2008 levels. The percentage of pupils attaining Level 4+ in English decreased by 1%.

Nationally, results for mathematics at Level 4+ rose by 1%. Results for science remained at 2008 levels and results for English declined by 1%.

Results in 2009 at Level 5 in English increased by 1% and in science declined by 3%. Results in mathematics at Level 5 increased by 2%.

Nationally, in 2009, results at Level 5 in English remained at 2008 levels. Results in mathematics at Level 5 increased by 4% and in science declined by 1%.

6. Dudley school sixth forms vary considerably in size. The DCSF 2009 achievement and attainment tables record the following numbers of 16-18 year olds on roll in the schools (figures in brackets are for 2008) – Bishop Milner 177 (163); Old Swinford Hospital 271 (275); Ellowes Hall 82 (90). The overall Dudley average point score per student and per examination declined slightly this year. It remains above the Black Country average but below the national average. The most notable performance by an individual school was at Bishop Milner Catholic School, where the average point score per student improved significantly from 640.0 in 2008 to 878.6 in 2009.
