Children in Poverty is measured by the number of dependent children (under 16) who live in households whose equivalised income is below 60% of the contemporary national median income. (For the poverty figures below, national median income year 2007, was around £24,000). Dudley employee median income was £20,753 for the year 2009.

For children living in poverty households where no parent is working then the main sources of income include Job Seekers Allowance, Incapacity Benefit, Income support, Child Benefit, Housing or Council Tax Benefits.

NB – figures only include households that are actively claiming out of work benefits or tax credits and are based on reported income.
