Dudley Your Home Your Forum Meeting – 7th November 2022 Feedback from the World Café Discussion



The World Café discussion allowed everyone present to share their knowledge of the local area and what makes it great, as well as identify things which could make the area even better. Four questions were used to guide the discussion. Feedback is provided below along with some links to helpful resources.

Question 1 - Listening to you and what's happening around you

Environment fly tipping was mentioned and discussed that it's an issue throughout the ward along with a concern around the current climate crisis.

Forum Funding process for approving grant applications needs clarifying, transparency of decision making, Christmas Tree lights needs to be consistent and centrally funded.

Built Environment including demolition of derelict Lodge Farm Community Centre and improvements to signs and street lighting. Parking issues around schools and parks were also discussed and improvements to pavements in Kates Hill.

Question 2 - What makes Dudley a great place to live, work & play? What do we love about this place e.g., history, culture, physical/natural environment, people, facilities?

People in attendance at the meeting identified a wide range of things which they love about Dudley. Comments have been themed below.

Green spaces, waterways and nature was mentioned including Saltwells Nature Reserve.

People, community and volunteering the people who live here, passionate, caring and good sense of humour.

History, heritage and culture Local assets in the community including, Dudley Zoo and Black Country Museum.

Question 3 - What would make Dudley an even better place to live, work and play in?

Ideas shared during this discussion have been categorised as either 'things that you as residents/ communities can do by yourselves or with some outside help' and 'things which will need outside agencies to develop/ deliver'.

Local economy

- Tourism discount for locals
- Local people to visit, use the services, attractions

Public services

Anti-social behaviour enforcements Illegal activities

Built environment

- Potholes, highways
- Street Lighting

Question 4 - If we could take action on one thing to strengthen this area/community, what would be the most important thing we could do?

Responses to this question have been categorised by theme and presented below.

Police/ community safety was mentioned by several people and included more police on the streets and more enforcement patrols. Reduction of anti-social behaviour and the need to improve facilities for young people.

Community including more community events and funding for community events to bring people together.

Community meetings feedback to the public to be in person, ensure police can attend meetings and local councillors to work together for the community.
