72 REVENUE BUDGET STRATEGY AND SETTING THE COUNCIL TAX, 2005/06

A joint report of the Chief Executive and the Director of Finance was submitted setting out the recommendations of the Cabinet concerning the deployment of General Fund revenue resources, a number of statutory calculations that had to be made by the Council and the Council Tax to be levied for the period 1st April, 2005 to 31st March, 2006.

It was moved by Councillor Mrs Millward and seconded by Councillor Fraser-Macnamara that the recommendations of the Cabinet, as set out in the report, be approved and adopted.

Following speeches by the Lead Opposition spokesmen and general debate by Members, the motion moved by Councillor Mrs Millward was put to the meeting and it was accordingly:

- (2) That the following amounts be now calculated by the Council for the year 2005/06 in accordance with Sections 32 to 36 of the Local Government Finance Act, 1992:-
 - (a) £528.564000m being the aggregate of the amounts which the Council estimates for the items set out in Section 32(2)(a) to (e) of the Act (the Council's Spending)
 - (b) £179.342000m being the aggregate of the amounts which the Council estimates for the items set out in Sections 32(3)(a) to (c) of the Act (the Council's income and use of reserves)

- (c) £349.222000m being the amount by which the aggregate at (a) above exceeds the aggregate at (b) above, calculated by the Council, in accordance with Section 32(4) of the Act, as its budget requirement for the year (the Council's budget requirement)
- £258.690373m being the aggregate of the sums (d) which the Council estimates will be payable for the year into its general fund in respect of redistributed non-domestic rates or revenue support grant [increased by the amount of the sums which the Council estimates will be transferred in the year from its collection fund to its general fund in accordance with Section 97(3) of the Local Government Finance Act, 1988] or [reduced by the amount of the sums which the Council estimates will be transferred in the year from its General Fund to its Collection Fund in accordance with Section 97(4) of the Local Government Finance Act. 1988] and [increased by the amount of any relevant sum which the Council estimates will be transferred from its Collection Fund to its General Fund pursuant to the directions under Section 98(4) of the Local Government Finance Act. 1988] or [reduced by the amount of any relevant sum which the Council estimates will be transferred from its General Fund to its Collection Fund pursuant to the directions under Section 98(5) of the Local Government Finance Act, 1988].
