Recommendations from Economic Regeneration Working Group

Report of the Lead Officer

Purpose of Report

 To consider two recommendations made at a meeting of the Select Committee on Regeneration, Culture and Adult Education (Economic Regeneration) Working Group held on 19th September, 2006.

Background

2. The Economic Regeneration Working Group at its meeting held on 19th September, 2006, considered a number of items including the Interim Corporate ICT Strategy 2006-2007 and Progress on Local Development Framework. Arising from the consideration given to these items the working group made the following recommendations:-

Interim Corporate ICT Strategy 2006-2007

RESOLVED

"(2) That the Select Committee on Regeneration, Culture and Adult Education be recommended to agree that the issue of the provision of Blackberries to Members of the Council be referred to the Members' ICT working group for further consideration and that the Head of ICT Services provide to that working group details of the usage by Members of their ICT equipment in order to inform the debate on this matter".

Progress on Local Development Framework

"(2) That the Select Committee on Regeneration, Culture and Adult Education be recommended to agree to the inclusion of the suggestion made, regarding the reported to future meetings of this working group on planning applications approved for apartments and other housing and the percentage of affordable housing contained therein over a six/twelve month period, in the work programme of this working group with a view to a report arising from the statistics produced relating to these matters being produced for consideration at a future meeting of the Select Committee on Regeneration, Culture and Adult Education".
