REPORT OF THE LEAD OFFICER TO THE SELECT COMMITTEE ON GOOD HEALTH

USE OF HEALTH IMPACT ASSESSMENTS

PURPOSE OF REPORT

 To receive and consider a recommendation of the Select Committee on Good Health regarding the use of Health Impact Assessments in future major decisions.

BACKGROUND

- 2. The Select Committee on Good Health at its meeting held on 17th November, 2005, considered a report of the Director of the Urban Environment on an Health Impact Assessment carried out on the closure of Brierley Hill Leisure Centre.
- 3. Arising from consideration of the report the Select Committee in endorsing the proposals in the report also resolved that
 - "The Cabinet be recommended that Health Impact Assessments form an integral part of any future major decision that affects health and well being in the Borough."

FINANCE

4. There are no direct financial implications from this report. However, if the recommendation is adopted there will be financial implications in the carrying out of any future Health Impact Assessments.

LAW
