4.	Apologies and declarations of interest	Apologies received from Councillor Q Zada and West Midlands Police No declarations of interest were received.			
5.	Forum funding	The Chair provided a summary of funding approved since the last meeting of which the 4 items below have recently been approved by the Community Grant Panel.

6. World Café event	The Chair introduced a World Café event. Everyone present, took part in table discussions to share their ideas and knowledge, and identify opportunities to work together to improve the local area.
	Following concerns expressed by some participants, Councillor S Mughal requested that the notes reflect her concerns regarding the disrespect that was shown to the Chair at this meeting.
	Councillor R Clinton requested that the notes reflect the procedural concerns he expressed at the meeting. He requested that the application relating to Quarry Bank Christmas lights be deferred further and indicated that he would raise the matter within the Council and with the Cabinet Member for Housing and Communities.
	Some Councillors and residents did not accept the Chair's explanation and robustly challenged the recommendation and the process by which it had been made. In view of the disagreement and the nature in which objections were made, the Chair and Vice-Chair made efforts to restore order within the meeting.
	A resident asked why the funding summary published online still said the application was deferred. The Chair confirmed this information would be updated in the next few days. Action: Community Development team to update online funding summary.
	The Chair confirmed that a recommendation had already been made to allocate funding towards Christmas lights after it had previously been deferred. Under the revised process, discussion on funding applications was now considered in a separate Community Grant Panel. The recommendation had been made to allocate £4,799 following consultation with Members by e-mail.
	Councillors and residents then queried why less funding was being allocated to Quarry Bank than had been requested given it was one of a few areas without lights and funding was available for allocation. Councillor R Clinton queried how a decision had been made when there was an outstanding query relating to the cost and number of lights to be provided.
	A resident representing St James' Road and Priory Close Neighbourhood watch asked for support to progress an application towards room hire and administration costs for her community group. Action: Community Development Worker to make contact to follow up on any applications
