# Report of the Licensing and Safety Committee

### Licensing Policy

# <u>Purpose</u>

1. To approve the Council's Licensing Policy, arising from a review of that policy.

#### **Background**

- 2. The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to review and publish a statement of its Licensing Policy every three years.
- 3. The Council, at its meeting held on 6<sup>th</sup> December 2004 approved the original policy. That Policy was subsequently published on 7th January 2005 and came into force on 7th February 2005.
- 4. The Policy was reviewed in March 2007 with the addition of the Cumulative Impact Policy.
- 5 In September 2007, letters were sent to:
  - a) The Chief Officer of Police;
  - b) The Fire Authority for the area;
  - c) Persons/bodies representative of local holders of premises licences;
  - d)Persons/bodies representative of local holders of club certificates;
  - e)Persons/bodies representative of local holders of personal licences; and,
  - f) Persons/bodies representative of businesses and residents in the area.
- 6 The Licensing Section has consulted with all the above bodies and there is a comprehensive list of consultees attached as an appendix to the Licensing Policy.
- 7 Arising from the consultations held, the Licensing and Safety Committee at a special meeting held on 13<sup>th</sup> November, 2007, considered a draft revision of the policy and comments received from consultees. The outcome of that consideration is the Licensing Policy recommended for approval by the Council.
