SITE AND SURROUNDINGS

- The trees subject to this application are three early mature sycamore trees. The trees are situated in the rear garden of 2 Sandmeadow place and are visible from sand meadow place over the roof of the bungalow and from Ridge Road over the rear garden of 1 Sandmeadow Place.
- 2. The trees subject to this application are remnants of the wooded area that covered this site prior to the infilling of the abandoned sand pit, and the development of the residential bungalows.

PROPOSAL

- 3. Summary of proposals for the works as written on application form is as follows:
 - Fell 3 Sycamore trees.
- 4. The trees have been marked on the attached plan.

HISTORY

5. There have been no previous Tree Preservation Order applications on this site.

PUBLIC CONSULTATION

6. No public representations have been received.

Further Assessment

- 7. The applicant has proposed to fell these trees as they consider them to be poor specimens. The applicant has also stated that he wishes to replace them with silver birch trees.
- 8. On inspection the trees were found to be in a poor state of health, with various defects. All of the trees have dead patches of bark, low vigour and slender stems; this is a result of the trees having grown up in a woodland situation prior to the development of the bungalows.
- 9. The top 50% of Tree 1 is now completely dead and the rest of the tree is likely to follow in the relatively near future. As such the removal of this tree is considered appropriate.
- 10. Trees 2 and 3, whilst not in any evident state of decline they have little vigour and a poor form. Whilst they may survive for a number of years they will only ever have

poor form, and due to their lack of vigour will always be susceptible to fungal infection.

11. It is considered that the amenity of the area will be improved in the long term if the trees are removed and replaced with specimens that will have a better form and visual appearance. It is suggested that only two tree are replaced as there is currently already a small silver birch and medium sized hawthorn in the garden. The planting of more than two trees is likely to cause problems with over crowding which in time will be to the detriment of the form and health of the trees.

CONCLUSION

- 12. This application proposes to fell 3 early mature sycamore trees. On inspection the trees were all found to be poor specimens, with various defects.
- 13. It is considered that the amenity of the area would be best served by the removal and replacement of the trees. Due to existing trees in the garden it is recommended that only two replacement trees are required, in order to prevent future problems with overcrowding.


RECOMMENDATION

14. It is recommended that application is approved subject to the conditions set out below.

Conditions and/or reasons:

- 1. The tree works subject of this consent shall be carried out in accordance with British Standard BS 3998:1989 'Recommendations for Treework'.
- 2. Two replacement trees shall be planted between the beginning of November and the end of March, within 1 year of felling (and replanted if necessary) and maintained until satisfactorily established. The size, species and location of the replacement trees shall be agreed in writing with the Local Planning authority prior to the felling of the trees to which this application relates.
- 3. The works hereby approved shall be carried out within 12 months of the date of this decision.
