The aim of this would be to give priority to local residents when allocating housing accommodation in the Borough in so far as the law permits."

This Council further recommends that no proposal on this matter should be put to this Council or the Cabinet prior to the 2<sup>nd</sup> February, 2006 other than any need to further extend the consultation period."
