Background

Early Years Foundation Stage

 2010 was the eighth year of the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile, an assessment which is reported at the end of the Reception year. The profile captures the six areas of learning of the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum as a set of 13 assessment scales.

Personal, social and emotional development (PSED)

Communication, language and literacy (CLL)

Mathematical development (MD)

Knowledge and understanding of the World (KUW)

Physical development (PD)

At the request of the Borough's schools, an Early Years Foundation Stage Profile mean was calculated for each school and for Dudley as a whole.

There is much to celebrate.

In 2010, all 13 scales of the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile showed improvement for the percentage of children attaining 6+ points. Most improvement was made in the Calculating scale, with a rise of 9%.

There was a 7.3% increase in the percentage of pupils achieving at least 78 points across the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile and increase of 8.5% in those achieving 6+ in all Personal, Social and Emotional Development scales; 8.2% in those achieving 6+ in all Communication, Language and Literacy Development scales.

The gap between the 20% lowest achieving pupils and all pupils decreased by 3.6% to 32%. This almost met the stretched target of 31.8%.

In 2009/2010, Dudley showed the 6th most improved outcomes nationally in Narrowing the Gap and made the 15th most improvement in Communication, Language and Literacy across all Local Authorities in the country.

However, analysis of the data shows that Writing remains an area for improvement, despite a movement of 6.2% in the percentage of children attaining 6+ points.

When you look at Tables 1 - 5, you will see that Dudley's standing varies, when compared with our statistical neighbours.

When compared with our geographical neighbours, we are fourth or better in all but Writing and Creative Development.

Areas for Development

To increase the number of children achieving 6+ outcomes in Personal, Social & Emotional Development and also Communication, Language and Literacy. To close the gap between the least well-performing children and the rest.

To further increase the number of children in Dudley borough achieving a 'good level of development'. This is measured as scoring al least 78 points on the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile (EYFSP), including all Personal, Social and Emotional Development and Communication, Language and Literacy scales.

To further close the achievement gap between the lowest performing group of children (as measured in the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile) and the rest.

The results for the Borough in 2010 increased by 2 percentage points in Reading and 1 percentage point in Writing; results in Mathematics decreased by 1 percentage point; Science remained the same. Nationally, results in 2010 increased by 1 percentage point in Reading, but remained at 2009 levels for Writing, Mathematics and Science.

Results at Key Stage 1 improved in Reading and Writing at Level 2 and Level 2b+. Dudley improved in Reading at Level 2+ and Level 2b+ at a better rate than nationally.

Dudley improved by 1 percentage point in Writing at Level 2+, while national results remained the same. At Level 2b+, Dudley improved by 1 ppt, which is a better rate of improvement than national, and remained at the same level as in 2009.

Dudley's trend of improvement in Reading and Writing at Key Stage 1 is better than national.

Generally, girls continue to perform better than boys at Key Stage 1. Boys outperform girls at Level 3 in Mathematics and Science. Boys improved on 2009 results in Reading and Writing at all levels. Girls improved at Level 2b+ in Reading and Writing. However, standards in Mathematics are maintained or have declined.

In Mathematics, results at Level 2 and Level 3 declined by 1 percentage point and remained the same as in 2009 at Level 2b+.

In Mathematics at Level 2+, Dudley standards declined by 1 percentage point, whereas the national result remained at 2009 levels. This puts Dudley below national results. At Level 2b+ in Mathematics, Dudley maintained 2009 levels when nationally standards declined by 1 percentage point. At Level 3, both Dudley and national standards remained at 2009 levels.

When you look at Table 7, you will see that, when ranked against our statistical neighbours, Dudley is second or third for Reading and Writing, but 8th for Mathematics.

Areas for Development

Continue to improve Key Stage 1 outcomes at Level 2+, particularly the proportion of Level 2b+ in Mathematics, Reading and Writing.

4. In 2010, only 32 schools participated in SATs due to industrial action. It must be noted that the schools who participated in SATs are not a statistically valid sample of schools across Dudley. Therefore, year-on-year comparisons of SAT results are not possible (see Table 10b for participation rates).

National SATs in Science in 2010 were only taken by a randomly selected group of schools across the nation. There were six schools in Dudley involved in the sample. The results are not returned to individual schools and consequently we no longer have a Dudley percentage for Science. Therefore, teacher assessment information is shown in the Key Stage 2 Performance Tables (Appendix 2) for comparison.

Nationally, in 2010, results at Level 4+ in English and Maths rose by 1 percentage point, but in Science declined by 4 percentage points.

Attainment in English increased by 1 percentage point to 82% at Level 4+ - above the national results of 81%.

Attainment in Maths has remained the same as in 2009 at Level 4+ (82%) and puts Dudley in line with 2010 national results.

Nationally, in 2010, results at Level 5 in English increased by 4 percentage points; in Maths remained at 2009 levels and in Science declined by 6 percentage points.

7. Dudley school sixth forms vary considerably in size. The Department for Education 2010 achievement and attainment tables record the following numbers of 16-18 year olds on roll in the schools (figures in brackets are for 2009) – Bishop Milner 177 (177); Oldswinford Hospital 264 (271); Ellowes Hall 72 (82). The overall Dudley average point score per student and per examination rose slightly this year. It remains above the Black Country average and also the national average. The most notable performance by an individual school was at Oldswinford Hospital, where the average point score per student improved significantly from 825.7 in 2009 to 888.3 in 2010.

Trends over Time - Key Stages 1, 2 and 4

8. It is important to look at trends over time to identify strengths and areas that require improvement (See Table 16).

Key Stage 1

Overall, the results at the end of Key Stage 1 at Level 2+, in all subjects (Reading, Writing and Maths), had increased in 2010. Results at Level 3 had increased in Reading and Writing and were maintained in Maths.

Key Stage 2

SATs results in English and Maths, at Levels 4+ and 5+, were not recorded due to industrial action. Results in teacher assessed Science were in line with national results at Level 4+ and 3% below at Level 5+.

Key Stage 4

Results at the end of Key Stage 4 for 5 A* - C and for 5 A* - C, including English and Mathematics, have improved over the past five years.

Results for Dudley over the past five years for 5 A* - C, including English and Mathematics, have improved at a faster rate than nationally (Dudley 12.8 percentage points, national 7.1 percentage points).
