  - (a) It has received a "U", "PG" (A), "15" (AA) or "18" (X) certificate of the British Board of Film Censors; or
  - It is a current newsreel which has not been submitted to the British Board of Film Censors; or
  - (c) It has received a "RESTRICTED (18)" Certificate of the British Board of Film Censors and the conditions specified are being complied with.
- Notwithstanding the conditions contained in the cinemas licence, a film may be exhibited, or persons or any class of persons, may be admitted thereto if the permission of the Licensing Authority is first obtained and the conditions of such permission are complied with.
