Background

Early Years Foundation Stage

 2008 was the sixth year of the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile, an assessment which is reported at the end of the Reception year. The profile captures the six areas of learning of the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum as a set of 13 assessment scales.

In 2008, results at Level 4+ in English and science increased by 2%. The percentage of pupils attaining Level 4+ in mathematics increased by 5%.

Nationally, results for English and mathematics at Level 4+ rose by 1%. Results for science remained at 2007 levels.

Results in 2008 at Level 5 in English declined by 4% and in science declined by 1%. Results in mathematics at Level 5 increased by 1%.

Nationally, in 2008, results at Level 5 in English declined by 5%. Results in mathematics at Level 5 declined by 1% and in science declined by 2%.

In 2008 the unvalidated Key Stage 3 results indicate that the percentage of pupils in Dudley that attained a Level 5 in English declined by 1%. Results in science declined by 1%. The percentage of pupils attaining Level 5 in mathematics increased by 1%.

Nationally, according to the latest figures available, results in mathematics rose by 1%. Results in English declined by 1% and in science declined by 2%.

The percentage of $5+ A^* - C$ grades increased in 2008 by 4.2%. Nationally, results for $5 A^* - C$ rose by 3.3%. The percentage of pupils attaining $5+ A^* - C$ remains above the national average.

The percentage of pupils attaining 5+ A* - C grades, including English and mathematics, in Dudley rose by 3.3%.

Nationally, results for pupils attaining 5 A* - C grades, including English and mathematics, rose by 0.9%.

The average points score rose by 7.0 points from 2007.

7. Dudley school sixth forms vary considerably in size. The DCSF 2008 achievement and attainment tables record the following numbers of 16-18 year olds on roll in the schools (figures in brackets are for 2007) – Bishop Milner 163 (131); Old Swinford Hospital 275 (269); Ellowes Hall 90 (63). The overall Dudley average point score per student and per examination declined slightly this year. It remains above the Black Country average but below the national average. The most notable performance by an individual school was at The Ellowes Hall Sports College, where the average point score per student improved significantly from 449.4 in 2007 to 640.0 in 2008.

The overall average points score per student in the borough, including figures for post-16 colleges as well as schools, declined slightly in 2008 [Dudley 733.1, National 739.8].

Trends Over Time - Key Stages 1, 2, 3 and 4

8. It is important to look at trends over time to identify strengths and areas that require improvement (See Table 16).

Key Stage 1

Overall, the results at the end of Key Stage 1 at Level 2+, in all subjects, declined in 2008. Results in 2008 at Level 3 in reading declined. Results at Level 3 in writing and mathematics remained at 2007 levels.

Key Stage 2

Overall, results at the end of Key Stage 2 at Level 4 have increased over the past four years. Results in English at Level 4+ have improved and are now in line with national results. Results in mathematics and science are now above national results. Whilst results at Level 5 in 2008 in English declined slightly, there is still an overall trend of improvement from 2005. The overall trend in mathematics at Level 5 is one of improvement from 2005. In science, the overall trend at Level 5 is one of levels being maintained.

Key Stage 3

The overall trend in mathematics and science is one of improvement from 2005 figures. In English, results have been maintained over this period, with a peak in 2007.

Key Stage 4

Results at the end of Key Stage 4 for 5 A* - C and for 5 A* - C, including English and mathematics, have improved over the past four years.

Results for Dudley over the past four years for $5 \, A^*$ - C, including English and mathematics, have improved at a faster rate than nationally (Dudley 5.8%, national 3.0%).

Areas for Development 2008/2009

9. Early Years Foundation Stage

To increase the numbers of children achieving 6+ outcomes in PSED and CLL. To close the gap between least well performing children and the rest.

Key Stage 1

Continue to improve Key Stage 1 outcomes at Level 2+, particularly proportion of Level 2b+ in mathematics and early reading and writing.

Key Stage 2

Improve 2 levels progress and close the gap by FSM and gender in Key Stage 2. Continue the focus on improving outcomes in girls' mathematics and boys' writing in Key Stage 2.

Key Stages 3 and 4

Reduce the number of schools below the Key Stage 4 floor target of 30% 5 A* - C, including English and mathematics.

Increase the percentage of pupils making 2 levels progress at both Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4 in English, mathematics and science.

Schools will continue to develop their own curriculum offer and will be supported by Dudley Children's Services and specific work from Black Country Challenge funding.

Finance

10. The work of the Early Years, Youth and Education Services Division is financed from Standards Grants and the Local Authority's base budget.
