REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR OF LAW AND PROPERTY

APPLICATION TO VARY A PREMISES LICENCE

PURPOSE

To consider the application for variation of the premises licence in respect of The Good Intent, 21 Vale Street, Upper Gornal, Dudley, West Midlands.

BACKGROUND

- On the 29th November, 2005, an application was received from Ridgeway Licensing Services, in respect of The Good Intent, 21 Vale Street, Upper Gornal, Dudley, West Midlands, to vary a premises licence. The application for variation of licence is attached to this report at Appendix 1.

- On the 19th September, 2005, an application to convert the licence was granted we have now received an application to vary this licence, this is as follows:

To allow sale of alcohol and regulated entertainment (films/indoor sporting events)

Mon – Thurs 10.00 – 00.00 Fri & Sat 10.00 – 01.00 Sun 10.00 – 00.00

Regulated entertainment (live music/recorded music/performance dance/provision of facilities for making music/dance)

Mon – Thurs 19.00 – 23.00 Fri & Sat 19.00 – 00.00 Sun 19.00 – 23.00

Provision of facilities for late night refreshment

Mon – Thurs 23.00 – 00.00 Fri & Sat 23.00 – 01.00 Sun 23.00 – 00.00 One extra hour after the finish times shown on the following days:-New Years Day, Valentine's Day, Thursday before Good Friday, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Sunday, Easter Monday, Sunday and Monday of all Bank Holiday weekends.

St Patrick's Day, St George's Day, St David's Day, St Andrew's Day. $23^{rd} - 30^{th}$ December inc New Years Eve – 36 hours as existing.

- Representations have been received from the Director of the Urban Environment and are attached to this report as appendix 2.

LAW

- The law relating to the granting of applications to vary premises licences is governed by the Licensing Act 2003, Section 11, Part 3 and Schedule 8, Part 1.
- Pursuant to Section 35(3)(a) of the Licensing Act 2003, where a relevant authority has made representations, the Licensing Authority must:-
 - Hold a hearing to consider item, unless the authority, the applicant and each person who has made such representations agree that a hearing is unnecessary, and
 - Having regard to the representations, take such of steps mentioned in subsection (4) (if any) as it considers necessary for the promotion of the Licensing objectives.
 - The steps are:-
 - to modify the conditions of licence;

- to reject the whole or part of the application.
- Pursuant to Section 36(1) and (4) of the Licensing Act 2003 where an application (or any part of an application) is granted or rejected under Section 35 of the Licensing Act 2003, the Licensing Authority must immediately give notice to that effect to:-
 - the applicant;
 - any person who made relevant representations in respect of the application and
 - the Chief Officer of Police for the police area in which the premises are situated
- In pursuance of Regulation 26(1) of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearing Regulations 2005), the Licensing Authority must make its determination at the conclusion of the hearing.
- If the Licensing Authority refuse to grant the application to vary the premises licence, there is a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court pursuant to Schedule 5, Part 1(b).
- Pursuant to Section 4(1), (2) and (3), Schedule 5 of the Licensing Act 2003, where the Licensing Authority grant an application to vary a premises licence in whole or in part. The applicant may appeal against any decision to modify the conditions of the licence under subsection 4(a) of Section 35 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 17 Where a person who made relevant representations to the application desires to contend:-
 - that any variation made ought not to have been made, or
 - that, when varying the licence, the Licensing Authority ought not to have modified the conditions of the licence, or ought to have modified item in a different way, under subsection 4(a) of Section 35 of the Licensing Act.

They have the right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court.

I have the following representation to make regarding the above variation, in respect of the licensing objective of preventing public nuisance.

I would recommend the following conditions are considered for this licence:

- 1) When entertainment, other than incidental music, is provided upon site, that any doors and windows are all kept closed, except when patrons leave or enter the building.
- 2) The door, to the front lobby entrance, is kept closed during entertainment.

In addition, this Department has received no complaints of alleged noise nuisance from the premises since 1999. One complaint was received in this year, regarding alleged noise from late night drinking, but was never substantiated.
