

# Select Committee on Children's Services – 18th June 2009

## Report of the Lead Officer to the Committee

## <u>Terms of Reference and Rules of Procedure of the Committee and Associated</u> <u>Matters including the Work Programme and Working Groups of the Committee for</u> <u>2009-2010</u>

## Purpose of Report

1. To receive the Terms of Reference and Procedure Rules applicable to this Committee and details of associated matters, and to consider the work programme and the appointment of Working Groups.

### **Background**

- 2. Article 6 of the Council's Constitution provides for the appointment of five Select Committees, including the Select Committee on Children's Services.
- 3. The terms of reference of the Select Committees are referred to in that Article and more fully in Table 1 of the Select Committee Procedure Rules. In respect of this Committee they provide for the Committee to fulfil all the functions of a Select Committee as they relate to Children's Services and in particular the functions of the Council under the Children Act 2004, and associated regulations and guidance including (a) the roles and responsibilities of relevant partnerships and (b) listening and involving children with the objective of improving the wellbeing of children in the Council's area by development the 'Every Child Matters' outcomes. Article 6 also prescribes the general role of Select Committees and their specific functions, including those relating to scrutiny.
- 4. The Select Committee Procedure Rules are contained in Part 4 of the Constitution. Procedure Rule 3 sets out details of Education representatives, both voting and non-voting. Legislation and regulations, entitle the Church and parent governor representatives to vote at meetings of the Committee on matters relating to education. As indicated, these arrangements have been incorporated into the Council's Constitution.
- 5. Attached, as Appendix 1, is the Scrutiny Protocol for Select Committees, which must be read in conjunction with the Select Committee Procedure Rules.
- 6. Members are also asked to note that other bodies involved with children's services issues are:

- (a) Schools Forum which acts as a consultative body on the Local Management of Schools, schools budgets and other issues relating to schools.
- (b) Children's Corporate Parenting Committee this body comprises members and officers and representatives from Black Country's Children's Rights and a young person with a remit to raise awareness of the Council's corporate parenting responsibilities for children, champion the needs of children in care in Dudley, monitor and review the Corporate Parenting Policy and review targets and achievements in relation to the outcomes from looked after children. The terms of reference of the Committee include a number of specific issues in relation to looked after children.
- (c) Admissions Forum this is a statutory body comprising representatives of the various admissions authority within the Borough with a remit to monitor and co-ordinate admissions policies across the Borough.
- 7. It is proposed that the work programme for 2009/10 include consideration of the following issues at the meeting of the Select Committee indicated:

- 8. It is proposed the Select Committee appoint three working groups as follows for 2009/10:
  - (a) Youth Working Group to consider integrated youth support and youth priorities.
  - (b) Social Care Working Group to consider child safeguarding and social care.
  - (c) Capital Programmes Working Group to consider particular issues relating to Capital Programme planning and Education Provision 3 years to 19 years (including Building Schools for the Future).
- 9. Inevitably, the appointment of further time limited Working Groups to consider particular issues as and when they occur may be necessary over the year and it is proposed that these will be set up on an ad hoc basis and appointed on a time limited basis.

## **Finance**

10. This report has no direct financial implications.

## <u>Law</u>

11. The relevant provisions regarding the Constitution are contained in Part II of the Local Government Act 2000, together with Regulations, Orders and Statutory Guidance issued by the Secretary of State.

- 13. Children and young people have not been consulted in the preparation of this report, but it will be necessary to consult with them and perhaps appoint representatives of them to serve on certain Working Groups.

- 15. That the work programme set out in paragraph 7 of this report be approved and that members be invited to discuss any further issues they consider to be included.

That the Working Groups for 2009/10 be considered and appointed in accordance with paragraph 8 above and that the Lead Officer to the Committee, in consultation with the Chairman, be authorised to appoint the membership of the Working Group from preferences to be expressed by Committee Members.
