Amendment of policy in relation to Street and House to House Collections

Purpose of Report

- 1. In January 1999, a policy was introduced requiring all applicants for House to House and Street Collection Permits to submit income and expenditure accounts for the previous financial year. This is to ensure that a substantial amount of monies collected are used for charitable purposes.
- In recent years applications for both Street Collection and House to House permits and have been received from independent commercial companies undertaking collections on behalf specific charities. In the first instance, a significant number of these companies submit the financial accounts of the charities for whom they are conducting the collections rather than their own company accounts.
- 3. To ensure that the correct company accounts are submitted with the application it is suggested that the wording of the policy is amended to read:-
 - 'All applicants for House to House or Street Collection permits shall submit their income and expenditure accounts for the previous financial year.'
- 4. This report has a direct link to the Council's priority for safety as the principal reason for submission in safeguarding the public.

6. House to House Collections are governed by Section 2 of the House to House Collections Act 1939 and Street Collection Permits by The Police, Factories, etc. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1916
