## REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR OF THE URBAN ENVIRONMENT

## PROPOSED SKATEPARK - STEVENS PARK, WOLLESCOTE

## 1.0 PURPOSE

- 1.1 To advise the Committee of the results of the public consultation carried out in respect of the proposed skatepark at Stevens Park, Wollescote
- 1.2 To seek the Committee's views on the proposed skatepark

## 2.0 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 Following work undertaken by a Working Group established by this Committee in 2002, at its meeting on the 15<sup>th</sup> November 2004 the Committee authorised that a consultation exercise be carried out with regard to the provision of a skatepark in Stevens Park, Wollescote.
- A feasibility study carried out by the officers in the Directorate of the Urban Environment has identified that a number of sites in Wollescote Park would be suitable for the construction of a skatepark. However, one of these sites falls within the geographical area covered by Halesowen Area Committee, and in line with the Council's approved strategy for skate/wheeled sports provision would not be eligible for consideration by Stourbridge Area Committee. As a result, and as referred to in the report to this Committee on the 15<sup>th</sup> November 2004, this site has not been included in the proposals put forward for public consultation.
- 2.3 The consultation exercise started on the 25<sup>th</sup> January 2004 and took the following format;
  - Postal consultation with a Freepost return questionnaire to all residents within 400 metres of the park boundary. This included residents in Cradley and Foxcote Wards and had a closing date of the 18<sup>th</sup> February 2005. 3,529 Households were invited to participate in the consultation
  - Consultation meeting with the Friends of Wollescote Park
  - Exhibition panel with Freepost questionnaires in local schools
  - o Consultation with 3 local youth groups
  - Consultation with West Midlands Crime Prevention Unit

- 2.4 The leaflet and questionnaire used in the postal questionnaire are included in appendices A & B
- 2.5 A full report on the consultation responses is included in appendix C. In summary, the results of the consultation are shown below;
  - 1,097 questionnaires were returned, representing a response rate of 28%
  - 68% of respondents supported the proposal for skatepark at Stevens Park, 23% opposed it and 9% had no opinion
  - Of those who opposed the proposals, the majority did so on the grounds of antisocial behaviour (64%) and unsuitability of Wollescote Park for a skatepark (18%)
  - The most popular location for the skatepark was Site 1 (as shown on Appendix A) with 23% in support, but this site also received the most opposition (29% strongly opposed)
  - The most popular response to a question about security of the skatepark was to provide tall perimeter fencing with lockable gates (50%)
- 2.6 The Friends of Wollescote Park have advised that whereas they would not have chosen the provision of a skatepark as the highest priority for improvement in the park, they do not object to its construction. However, they expressed concerns about the capacity of the existing car park to take any extra visitors and over issues associated with the maintenance of the skatepark.
- 2.7 The West Midlands Police Crime Prevention Unit have advised that they have no objection to any of the sites, as all the sites suggested are well located; they support the scheme providing it is designed adequately; and they would prefer to see a scheme with either controlled fencing and gates with lighting, or no security at all.
- 2.8 Should the proposal proceed, implementation will be subject to the determination of a planning application for the skatepark and associated works and funding approval through the Council's Capital Programme. Subject to these approvals and the acceptance of a suitable tender for the work, the skatepark may reasonably be expected to be completed by September 2005.
- 2.9 A letter will be sent to all those invited to participate in this consultation advising the of the outcome of the consultation

## 3.0 PROPOSAL

3.1 That following the results of the public consultation exercise a skate park be constructed at Wollescote Park on site

3.2 That the costs of constructing the skate park be established and that a request be made to the Cabinet to include this within the Council's Capital Programme.

## 4.0 FINANCE

4.1 The costs of the project are to be funded by the Community Facilities budget contained within Culture & Community's capital programme and from available Section 106 funds

## 5.0 LAW

5.1 The Council may provide recreational facilities under section 19 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous) Provisions) Act 1976

## **Skatepark Consultation Summary report**

## February 2005

A postal consultation was carried out in January and February 2005 to all residential properties within 400 metres of the boundary of the park. 3529 households were invited to participate in the consultation as a result. The consultation took the form of a leaflet explaining the proposals and the option sites where the skatepark could be located, and a questionnaire where residents could note their comments on the proposals, to be returned with a Freepost envelope. A copy of the leaflet, questionnaire and plan showing the area covered by the questionnaire is appended to this report.

Plans showing the proposals were exhibited at The Grange and Wollescote primary schools with leaflets and questionnaires available for return. Leaflets and questionnaires were also issued to the following;

- Youth and Community Workers
- Lye Area Regeneration Alliance
- Lye and Wollescote Partnership
- o Wollescote Community Centre

Officers attended a meeting held by the Friends of Wollescote Park on the 25<sup>th</sup> January in order to explain the proposals, and leaflets and questionnaires were left with this group for. At the meeting, the Friends noted that whereas they would not have chosen the provision of a skatepark as the highest priority, they did not object to its construction but had reservations about the capacity of the existing car park to take any extra visitors. The Friends also expressed concern that the cost of maintaining the skatepark might result in savings being made on maintenance of the park, with reductions in maintenance standards as a result.

A total of 3,850 questionnaires were issued as a result of the above, and by the closing date of the 18<sup>th</sup> February 1,097 had been returned. The response rate may therefore be expressed as 28%.
