Report of the Director of Law and Property

Application for Amusements with Prize Machines Permit

Purpose of Report

1. To consider the application for the grant of an amusements with prizes machines permit for three machines on behalf of Poppleston Allen in respect of the Lawnswood, Lawnswood Road, Wordsley, Stourbridge, West Midlands.

Background

2. On the 18th May 2005, an application was received from Poppleston Allen Solicitors in respect of The Lawnswood, Lawnswood Road, Wordsley to convert an existing licence into a premises licence and to vary the premises licence simultaneously. That application was granted on the 14th June 2005. The premises licence is issued for the following days, times and conditions.

Late night refreshment	Mondays to Sundays (Plus non-standard times as per the sale of alcohol)	10:00 00:00
Exhibition of a film	Monday to Sunday (Plus non-standard times as per the sale of alcohol)	10:00 00:00
Sale of alcohol	Mondays to Sundays	10:00 00:00

Non-standard timings: In the event of the transmission of any recognised international event which falls outside the current permitted hours on the premises to permit the activity commencing one hour before the start of the event and ending one hour after the end of the event. Details of which to be notified in writing to the police 14 days beforehand. The event will not proceed if the police serve 7 days prior to the event, written notice upon the designated premises supervisor.

Plus on the following days additional hours are to be permitted for the licensable activity (not including drinking up time) 1st January 1 hour, Valentines Night 1 hour, Burns Night 1 hour, 1st March (St Davids) 1 hour, 17th March (St Patricks) 1 hour, Good Friday 1 hour, Easter Saturday 1 hour, Easter Sunday 1 hour, Easter Monday 1 hour, May Bank Holiday (1st) Friday prior 1 hour, May Bank Holiday (1st) Saturday prior 1 hour, May Bank Holiday (1st) Sunday prior 1 hour, May Bank Holiday (1st) Bank Holiday Monday 1 hour, May Bank Holiday (2nd) Friday prior 1 hour, May Bank Holiday (2nd) Saturday prior 1 hour, May Bank Holiday (2nd) Sunday prior 1 hour, May Bank Holiday (2nd) Bank Holiday Monday 1 hour, August Bank Holiday Friday prior 1 hour, August Bank Holiday Saturday prior 1 hour, August Bank Holiday Sunday prior 1 hour, August Bank Holiday Monday 1 hour, Halloween 1 hour, Christmas Eve 2 hours, Boxing Day 1 hour, 27th December 1 hour, 28th December 1 hour, 30th December 1 hour. End of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to commencement of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

3. On the 1st August 2007, an application was received for the grant of a permit for three amusements with prizes machines at the premises, a copy of that application together with a plan of the premises is attached as Appendix 1 to this report.
4. The local authority licensing policy states as follows:
 - The Licensing Authority will be prepared to grant without a hearing, permits authorising up to two Section 34 Gaming Act machines in any premises. If authorisation is sought for more than two machines the applicant will be required to attend a hearing to support the application. All plans submitted with applications for premises licences must set out the siting of each Amusement with Prizes machine.
 - Parliament has placed no restrictions on the age at which such machines may be played (other than those in amusement arcades). It is therefore a matter for the discretion of the premises licence holder and any adults accompanying the children concerned whether they are entitled to play such machines. In the case of premises used exclusively or primarily for the consumption of alcohol, all children under the age of 16 will only be permitted entry to the premises if accompanied by adults. All such machines must be sited in accordance with the Gaming Act, further advice will be given on receipt of application.
 - There is unlikely to be the need for a hearing where the application is for renewal of the existing permit for more than two machines or where the application is for the grant of an Amusements with Prizes permit at premises which already have an existing permit for more than two machines, and where that number is not increased.
5. The current licence holder is Mitchells and Butlers Leisure Retail Ltd and the current Designated Premises Supervisor is A M Hodge.

6. This application falls within the Council's recent responsibility for liquor licensing which has a direct link to the Council's key corporate priority that safety matters.

Finance

7. There are no financial implications.

Law

8. The Council is the appropriate Authority for the purpose of considering applications for the grant of a permit to use machines for gaming, under Section 34 and Schedule 9 of the gaming Act 1968.
9. Under Paragraph 8(1)(a) of Schedule 9, the Council has absolute discretion as to whether or not to grant a permit.
10. If the Committee decides to grant this application, then it is open to the Committee to grant the application subject to a condition limiting the number of machines, which may be made available on the premises.

Equality Impact

11. This report complies with the Council's policy on equal opportunities.
12. The licensing of premises and individuals will impact on children and young people through their attendance at licensed premises.
13. There has been no consultation or involvement of children and young people in developing these proposals.

Recommendation

14. That the Sub-Committee determine the application.
