

## **Dudley Children's Centres - Summary of Census 2011 Data and Estart Data for Dudley Area**

### Introduction

The Census 2011 data has now been released by Super Output Areas (SOAs) and has been amalgamated into reach areas for each of the 20 children's centres and also produced totals for the Dudley borough area. Additionally the data from the Estart system which counts activities within the centres has also been collated and tables produced summarising the data by centre and totalled for Dudley. The data used has been the latest quarter's information up to 30<sup>th</sup> June 2013; and where available the annual totals for 2012/13 (ending 31<sup>st</sup> March 2013).

This document provides a summary of the data for the Dudley Borough area; it considers data related to deprivation levels (measured by the Index of Multiple Deprivation IMD 2010) and creates percentages of Estart figures against Census data where possible.

### Children Aged 0-4 years in Dudley Borough Council area

14,991 (79% of total children)

Number of children who attended sessions or were supported by CC in Quarter 1 2013/14 and taken part in at least one activity – 5,861 (31% of all children 0-4 years) 1,232 (21%) of these were from outside of the reach areas of the children's centres but within the borough area

Children 0-4 from deprived areas attending CC or supported during Q1 2013/14

- 848 children from the 10% most deprived SOAs (i.e. 31% of all children 0-4 years from the 10% SOAs)
- 944 children from the 10-20% most deprived SOAs (i.e. 28% of all children 0-4 years from the 10-20% SOAs)
- 1,054 children from the 20-30% most deprived SOA (i.e. 29% of all children 0-4 years from the 20-30% SOAs)
- 2,846 children from outside the 30% most deprived SOAs (i.e. 29% of all children 0-4 years from the SOAs outside the 30% most deprived)

*(these figures relate to the children from within the reach area of a children's centre in order to compare them with the most deprived SOAs)*

*At present Census data does not include Ethnic Groups by age; therefore proportions of each group registering and attending the children's centres cannot be calculated. However 70% of registrations at the children's centres are white British whereas 89% of all residents in Dudley are white British. This infers that the minority ethnic groups are more likely to use children's centres and/or there are a higher proportion of younger children who are from the minority groups.*
