Appointments to Outside Bodies

Purpose of Report

 To authorise the Director of Law and Property, in consultation with the Leader, to make appointments to certain outside bodies in view of the urgency involved in making such appointments.

Background

2. Following consultations with the Leader it is proposed that the Director of Law and Property, in consultation with the Leader, make appointments to the following outside bodies in view of the urgency involved in making such appointments:-

In accordance with the Scheme of Delegation contained in the Constitution of the Council, the appointments to be made to other outside bodies would usually be considered at a meeting of the Cabinet. However, given the timetabling of meetings of the Cabinet and Area Committees in June, 2006, it is also proposed that appointments to be made by Area Committees be referred direct to those Committees.

Finance

4. The financial implications arising from these appointments will be met from existing resources.

Law

5. The statutory provisions relating to the above matter are contained in Section 111 of the Local Government Act, 1972, Sections 15-18 of the Local Government and Housing Act, 1989, and the relevant provisions of the Local Government Act, 2000.
