Tackling anti social behaviour occurring out of normal office hours Provide greater treatment and support to people experiencing drug or alcohol misuse problems Promote the safety of older people by a range of actions e.g. the bogus callers scheme, the Carer's card scheme, and senior safety week. Dutcomes to include: - Reduce vehicle crime in the borough by 5% in 2005/06 Reduce crime and anti social behaviour through the use of 20 or more ASBOs 	 Creating a borough which has a successful economy offering well paid jobs is central to the prosperity and quality of life of every resident.
