

<u>Halesowen Area Committee Report – 13 January 2011</u>

Report of the Director of the Urban Environment

Nimmings Road Area, Shell Corner, Halesowen: Proposed Traffic Regulation Orders

Purpose of Report

1. To report back to Area Committee on the outcome of further consultations in relation to Traffic Regulation Order proposals for Shell Corner, Halesowen.

Background

- 2. Following the consideration of guidance from the members of the Halesowen Area Committee on 10 November, a meeting was held with Councillor Karen Shakespeare and the organiser of a petition against original proposals for waiting restrictions in Nimmings Road, Long Lane, Malt Mill Lane, Green Lane, Masters Lane, Fairfield Road, Douglas Road and Birch Drive, Shell Corner, Halesowen.
- 3. Whilst the organiser of the petition expressed himself to be satisfied with new and much reduced proposals at the 10th November meeting it was felt that there had been insufficient time allowed for the main petitioner to report back to other signatories of the petition.
- 4. Also as part of discussions at the November meeting of the Area Committee it was agreed that under the new procedures for dealing with petitions, the one way street proposals for Green Lane and Clement Road should be further considered. A petition of support was received for the Green Lane/Clement Road one way street proposals, but there was a view expressed by Members of the Committee that further consultation might be beneficial.
- 5. Therefore in line with the Committee's request, the following proposals have been subject to further consultation. No further objections have been received.

Sustainable Transport

6. Measures to improve pedestrian and cyclists' visibility, together with the reduction of obstructive parking, will assist sustainable methods of transport.

Finance

7. The estimated cost of implementing all of the Shell Corner Traffic Regulation Orders is £30,000. This can be met from the 2010 -11 Minor Capital allocation.

Law

- 8. Traffic Regulation Orders are made under powers contained in Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
- 9. Traffic signs are provide under powers contained in section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, subject to regulations made by the Secretary of State for Transportation.
- 10. The Council is empowered to improve highways under Section 62 of the Highways Act 1980.
- 11. Section 111 of the Local Government Act 1972 empowers the Council to do anything calculated to facilitate or is conducive or incidental to the discharge of any of its functions.
- 12. The Traffic Calming Act 1992 amends the Highways Act 1980 to allow works to be carried out to promote safety and to preserve or improve the environment.

13. The proposals contained within this report comply with the Council's Equality and Diversity Policy, whilst also seeking to introduce measures to improve transport for vulnerable road users including meeting the needs of children and young people.
