#### Library

Things that were good

- Location in the centre
- Lots of things available like talking books, books in different languages, books with large print, CDs, DVDs, leaflets, posters with information, computers and newspapers. All clearly labelled.
- Staff very helpful
- Open late one evening due to public demand.

#### Things that need to improve

- Not much information available about services for people with learning disabilities- staff printed off 2-day centre names with phone numbers and a contact for adult placement.
- Need more leaflets about services and in easy read.
- The lift location is hidden and have to have library staff support you in the lift-I think this may put people off wanting to come in as its not very welcoming.
- Only one toilet for both men and women
- No changing room
- Having to ask for the adaptive equipment for the computer- why can't it already be plugged into a computer?

### Things that need to improve

- Not very much information about services for people with learning disabilities
