

**Central Dudley Area Committee - 18<sup>th</sup> January 2011**

**Report of the Acting Area Liaison Officer**

**Capital Allocations**

**Purpose of Report**

1. To consider the recommendations of the Capital Allocations Working Group with regard to allocations to organisations from the committee's delegated capital budget for this part of the 2010/11 financial year.

**Background**

2. The Central Dudley Area Committee Capital Allocations Working Group considered 5 new applications to be heard at the January Area Committee.
3. Members representing Castle & Priory, Quarry Bank & Dudley Wood, Netherton, Woodside & St Andrews, St James's & St Thomas's Wards were present. The meeting was chaired by Cllr. K Finch, Deputy Chair of Capital Allocations Working Group in the absence of the Chair. Cllr Ahmed.
4. The recommendations Working Group have made are detailed in Appendix 1. This includes the recommendation for a change to the existing application criteria.

**Finance**

5. Because each of the 5 Wards has its own allocation the current balances are as follows :

Castle and Priory	£9,643.84
Netherton Woodside and St Andrews	£6,548.98
Quarry Bank and Dudley Wood	£17,402.25
St James's	£9,366.92
St Thomas's	£5,419.08
<b>Total Available</b>	<b>£48,381.07</b>

6. If the recommendations of the Working Group are agreed by Area Committee this would result in new commitments of £7,949.19 broken down as follows :

Castle and Priory	£ 276.75
Netherton Woodside and St Andrews	£3,533.55
Quarry Bank and Dudley Wood	£ 0.00
St James's	£ 879.63
St Thomas's	£3,259.25
<b>Total of Proposed New Commitments</b>	<b>£7,949.19</b>

7. Depending on the decision of the Area Committee the balances outlined in section 5 for each ward would then be reduced to the following for the remainder of the 2010/11 Civic Year

Castle and Priory	£9,367.09
Netherton Woodside and St Andrews	£3,015.43
Quarry Bank and Dudley Wood	£17,402.25
St James's	£8,487.29
St Thomas's	£2,159.83
<b>Total Remaining</b>	<b>£40,431.89</b>

### **Law**

8. Part 1 of the Local Government Act 2000 enables the Council to do anything that it considers likely to achieve the promotion or improvement of the social, environmental, or economic well being of its area.
9. Section 111 of the Local Government Act 1972 enables the Council to do anything that is calculated to facilitate, or is conducive to or incidental to, the discharge of its statutory functions.

### **Equality Impact**

10. The awarding of capital grants to community and voluntary organizations, some of which represent minority groups, is specifically intended to assist in improving the well being, directly or indirectly, of all minority groups.
11. The awarding of capital grants also has the specific purpose of creating general benefits for the wider community and therefore fully meets the policy on Equality and Diversity of the Council

12. Many of the groups or communities helped by these capital grants will include beneficial help to children and young people. However, there has been no direct consultation with children and young people in developing these proposals

## **Recommendations**

13. It is recommended that: -
- The Area Committee considers the recommendations of the Capital Allocations Working Group given in Appendix 1 and approves these for implementation.
  - The Area Liaison Officer is authorised to carry out the recommended actions within the agreed control procedures.
