Comment: Sentencing outcomes are down by 48. 10-13 year olds are down to 6.7% of all offenders, reflecting the impact of Community Resolutions. 15-17 year olds are now 83.2% and 17 year olds now account for 41% of all sentenced young people. Males 82.3%, girls 17.7%, this sees a rise in the levels girls in the system despite an overall drop in numbers.

Comment: two girls have committed 48 offences of criminal damage which distorts these figures. Overall offending down by 98. All offence numbers are down, however concern remains around the slight increase in the number of sexual offences particularly committed by younger boys and the slight increase in the level of robbery. The peak age for offending is girls 14 years old and their peak offence is violence against the person and boys its 17 years old with the peak offence being motoring offences, closely followed by theft and handling and drugs offences.
