# Report of the Director of the Urban Environment

## Measures to assist Cycle access to High Street, Stourbridge

# <u>Purpose</u>

1. To seek Committee's views on proposals to introduce measures to assist cycle access to High Street, Stourbridge

## **Background**

- 2. The Local Authority holds quarterly Cycle Forums with relevant interest groups, primarily to consider proposals and/or opportunities that would either support or promote cycling within the borough.
- 3. An issue raised at the Cycle Forum meeting on the 7<sup>th</sup> September 2010 suggested that dropped kerbs in the vicinity of 'The Chequers Inn' in High Street, Stourbridge would be helpful in enabling cyclists who have crossed the ring road using the nearby Toucan Crossing to then rejoin the public highway and directly access the town centre.
- 4. In order to undertake this manoeuvre as safely as possible, there is a need to ensure that cyclists do not suddenly emerge onto the highway from between parked vehicles and so, with reference to Drawing No. HT 3139 -2, attached as Appendix A, the introduction of a physical build-out to prevent vehicles parking in this area is considered appropriate.
- 5. This approach would result in the loss of one car parking space in the town centre and should not, therefore, detract from either the existing parking provisions in this area or any subsequent modifications that may emerge following consideration of the Traffic Regulation Orders currently being advertised for the Stourbridge area generally.

## 6. <u>Sustainable Transport</u>

The contents of this report support the Council's Transport Policy by considering measures that would contribute directly towards improved highway links for cyclists.

# **Finance**

7. The implementation of proposals outlined within this report can be funded under the allocation for Cycling Measures approved as part of the 2010/2011 Highways Minor Works Capital Programme.

## Law


- 8. The Council is empowered to improve highways under Section 62 of the Highways Act 1980.
