ROAD	OBJECTIONS	COUNCIL'S RESPONSE
Cradley Road – Prohibition of Waiting	From 1 business in Cradley Road, concerned about deliveries.	Loading and unloading of goods and picking up and setting down of passengers is permitted on double yellow lines. The objection should be overruled
Castleton Street – Prohibition of Waiting	From 2 residents in Castleton Street, concerned about residents being prohibited from parking in Castleton Street, although both agree residents suffer from on street parking by non-residents.	At present the Council is unable to offer a residents parking scheme. The proposals only extend 13 metres into Castleton Street on the North West kerbline from it's junction with St Johns Street to preserve visibility and improve safety for all road users and wouldn't significantly reduce the amount of parking available to residents. The objection should be overruled
Arch Hill Street – Prohibition of Waiting	From 1 resident from Arch Hill Street disagrees with the proposals around the junction of Arch Hill Street with Halesowen Road and Baptist End Road, claims parked vehicles here do not cause issues with visibility.	Parking is not permitted opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space in accordance with section 243 of The Highway Code. The objection should be overruled.
Halesowen Road – Prohibition of Waiting	From 2 businesses in Halesowen Road concerned about customer parking directly outside premises.	Parking is not permitted opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space in accordance with section 243 of The Highway Code. The objection should be overruled.
