

# Stourbridge Area Committee – 15 November 2010

## Report of the Director of the Urban Environment

## Proposed Traffic Regulation Order to Control Waiting in the Greater Stourbridge Area

### Purpose of Report

- 1. To seek the Committee's support for the introduction of a Traffic Regulation Order to control waiting in an area centred on Stourbridge. The attached plans show: -
  - the lengths of yellow lines not objected to;
  - the lengths objected to and amended as in Appendix A;
  - the lengths of yellow lines that have been objected to where it is recommended that objections be overruled.

Original proposals that are not now being pursued are shown in Appendix A but are not included in plans.

The plans only show the current recommendations for a Traffic Regulation Order.

#### **Background**

- 2. Proposals resulting from requests from residents and businesses in a large area around Stourbridge were advertised as set out below.
- 3. Letters were sent to ward members and the Police on 6 January 2010.
- 4. The proposals were advertised in the 'Express and Star' newspaper on 27 May 2010 and also on street between 27 May 2010 and 25 June 2010.
- 5. Over 200 individual objections were received together with 5 petitions relating to various areas covered by the proposals. These are detailed in appendix A.

#### Sustainable Transport

6. Measures to improve pedestrians' and cyclists' visibility around bends and junctions together with reducing obstructive parking would assist sustainable methods of travel.

### <u>Finance</u>

7. The estimated cost of implementing the Traffic Regulation Order referred to in this report is £12,000, which can be met from the 2010-11 Minor Capital Allocation.

### Law

8. Traffic Regulation Orders are made under powers contained in Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

### Equality Impact

9. The propsals contained within this report comply with the Council's Equality and Diversity Policy, whilst also seeking to introduce measures to benefit vulnerable road users.

### **Recommendation**

10. That Members support the proposals and make recommendations for the Cabinet Member for Transportation to consider. It is suggested that the scheme described in appendix A and shown on the attached plans be introduced.
