Covid-19 Secure Working

Hands

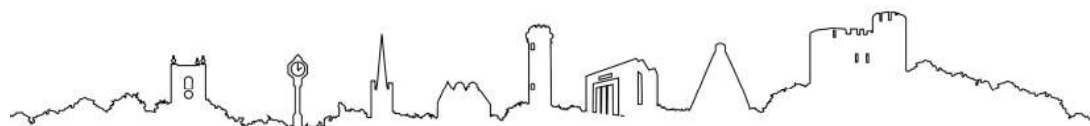
- All persons attending meetings are strongly encouraged to be double vaccinated to limit ill-health effects should a transmission of coronavirus occur.

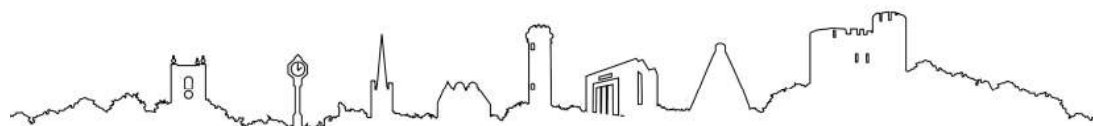

Report of the Interim Director of Public Realm

Application for a Licensed Premises Gaming Machine Permit

The Original Bowling Company Limited Trading As Hollywood Bowl .

Purpose

1. To consider the application for the grant of a Licensed Premises Gaming Machine permit for 5 category C machines and 35 category D machines, in respect of the premises known as Hollywood Bowl, Unit U100, Merry Hill Centre, Brierley Hill, West Midlands.

Recommendation

2. That the Committee determine the application for the grant of a permit for 5 category C machines and 35 category D machines in respect of the premises to be known as The Hollywood Bowl, Merry Hill Centre.

Background

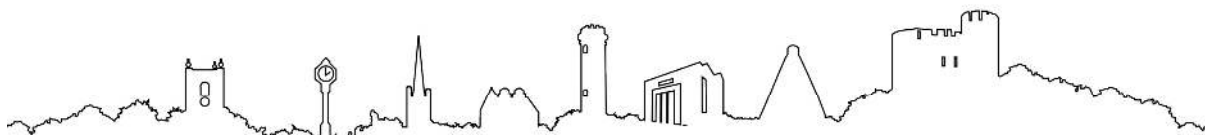
3. The Hollywood Bowl, holds a current premises licence for the following:

Supply of Alcohol and Regulated Entertainment

Monday to Sunday inc 09.00 until 01.00

Late Night Refreshment/Hours Open to the Public

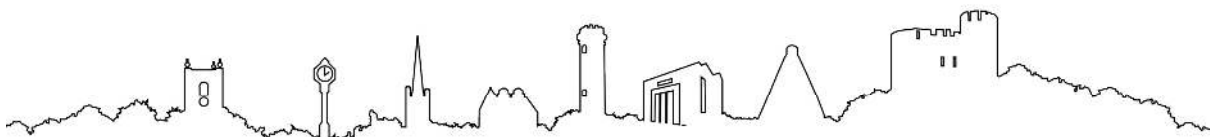
Monday to Sunday inc 09.00 until 01.30



4. The Local Authority licensing policy states as follows:-

- If authorisation is sought for more than two category C or D machines the applicant will be required to attend a hearing to support the application. All plans submitted with applications for premises licences must set out the siting of each category C or D machine.
- Parliament has placed no restrictions on the age at which category D machines may be played (other than those in amusements arcades). It is, therefore, a matter for the discretion of the premises licence holder and any adults accompanying the children concerned whether they are entitled to play such machines. In the case of premises used exclusively or primarily for the consumption of alcohol, all children under the age of 16 will only be permitted entry to the premises if accompanied by adults. All such machines must be sited in accordance with the Gaming Act.
- There is unlikely to be the need for a hearing where the application is for renewal of the existing permit for more than two machines or where the application is for the grant of a Licensed Premises Gaming Machine Permit at premises which already have an existing permit for more than two machines, and where that number is not increased.

5. On 27th October 2022, TLT Solicitors made application on behalf of Original Bowling Company Limited trading as Hollywood Bowl for the grant of a licensed premises Gaming Machine Permit for 5 category C machines and 35 category D machines. The application been forwarded to Committee Members and Interested Parties. The applicant is unable to supply a detailed site plan identifying the position of the machines as the premises is due to be refurbished following the change of use from a retail store.



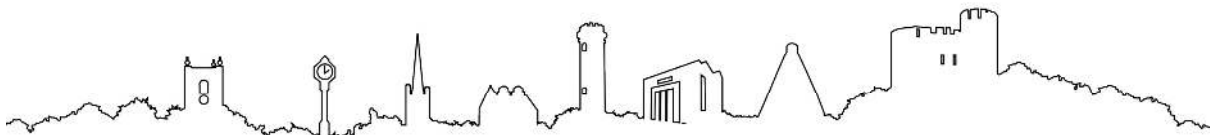
6. The current licence holder of the premises licence is The Original Bowling Company Limited.

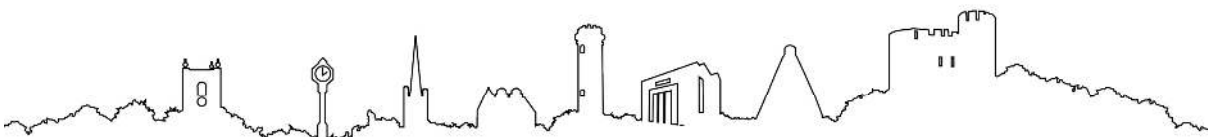
8. Pursuant to part 12, section 283 of the Gambling Act 2005 the Council can grant a licensed premises gaming machine permits.
9. Pursuant to schedule 13 4(2) on considering an application for a permit the Licensing Authority shall:-
- (a) grant an application
 - (b) refuse the application, or
 - (c) grant it in respect of:-
 - (i) a smaller number of machines than that specified in the application
 - (ii) a different category of machines from that specified in the application, or
 - (iii) both
10. Pursuant to schedule 13, 5
- (1) A Licensing Authority may not attach conditions to a permit
 - (2) As soon as is reasonably practicable after granting an application a Licensing Authority shall issue a permit to the applicant.



11. Pursuant to schedule 13, 5(3) as soon as it reasonably practicable after refusing an application a Licensing Authority shall notify the applicant of:-
 - (a) the refusal, and
 - (b) the reasons for it

12. In pursuance of schedule 13 6 (2) a Licensing Authority may not refuse an application, or grant an application in respect of a different category or smaller number of gaming than that specified in the application, unless they have
 - (a) notified the applicant of their intention to refuse or grant the application in respect of
 - (i) a smaller number of machines than that specified in the application
 - (ii) a different category of machines than that specified in the application or
 - (iii) both, and
 - (b) given the applicant an opportunity to make representations

13. In pursuance of schedule 13 6 (3) a Licensing Authority can satisfy the opportunity to make representations by giving the applicant an opportunity to make:-
 - (a) oral representations
 - (b) written representations, or
 - (c) both



14. In pursuance of schedule 13 21 (1) the applicant for a holder of a permit may appeal to the Magistrates Court if the Licensing Authority:-
- (a) reject an application for a permit
 - (b) grant an application for a permit in respect of a smaller number of machines than that specified in the application or a different category of machines from that specified in the application.

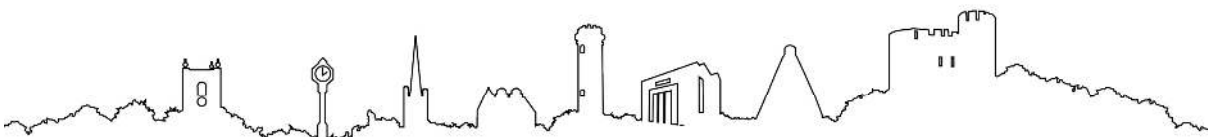

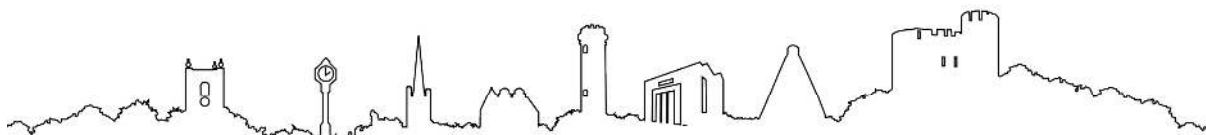

Report of the Interim Director of Public Realm

Application for Grant of Consent to Engage in Street Trading

Mark Smith trading as Frank Smith (Dudley) Ltd – Dudley Town Centre.

Purpose

1. To consider the application made by Mr Mark Smith for the grant of a consent to engage in street trading in Dudley Town Centre.

Recommendation

2. That the Committee consider the application for the grant of a consent to engage in street trading for the sale of Fast Food in Castle Street, Dudley. (Outside Greggs).

Background

3. On the 11th October 2022, an application was received by the Licensing Office from Mr Mark Smith trading as Frank Smith (Dudley) Ltd for the grant of a consent to engage in street trading in Castle Street, Dudley (outside Greggs) to sell fast food, Hot Dogs, Burgers, Chicken Nuggets, Asian Food etc together with Ice Cream and Hot and Cold Drinks Monday to Sunday 9.00 am until 3.00am

4. That application together with details of the proposed site and photograph of the trading vehicle have been circulated to committee members and interested parties, details of the application have also been posted on the Council Web Site.

No objections in respect of the application have been received.

5. Mr Smith previously held a consent for the same site that consent expired in 2021.

Finance

6. There are no financial implications.

Law

7. The grant of consents to engage in street trading is governed by Part III of Schedule IV to the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982. To trade without such consent is an offence.
8. Paragraph 7(2) of Schedule IV of the 1982 Act, states that the Council may grant a consent if it thinks fit and, when granting or renewing a consent, the Council may attach such conditions as it considers necessary.
9. Paragraph 10 of Schedule IV of the 1982 Act, states that a street trading consent may be granted for one period not exceeding 12 months but may be revoked at any time.
10. Where the consent allows the holder to trade from a cart, barrow, or other vehicle, then the consent must specify the location from which they may trade and the times between which or periods for which they may trade.
11. There is no right of appeal against the Council's decision to vary a condition upon which consent is issued, or refusal to grant or renew a street trader's consent.

Application for House to House Collections Licence

Purpose of Report

1. To consider the application for the grant of a House to House Collections Licence received from Clothing Connection Ltd on behalf of City and Sport (Ukraine).

Recommendation

2. That the Committee consider the application for a House to House Collection Licence in respect of City and Sport.

Background

3. On the 12th October 2022, Mr Andrius Kulikauskas of Clothing Connection Ltd made application for a House to House Collections Licence on behalf of the City and Sport. A copy of that application has been forwarded to Committee Members and interested parties.
4. In January 1999, the Licensing Section in accordance with the Neighbouring Authorities Working Group introduced a policy requiring all House to House Collection applicants to submit income and expenditure accounts for the previous financial year.
5. In recent years applications for House to House Collections have been received from independent commercial companies undertaking collections on behalf of specific charities. Therefore in November 2009 the Council introduced a further policy that all applicants for House to House Collection Licences be required to submit with the application income and expenditure accounts for the previous financial year of the charity for which the collection is being made and also for the company or organisation making the collection. This is to

ensure that a substantial amount of the monies collected are used for charitable purposes. Copies of the accounts in respect of City and Sport have been received and translated into English at a cost to this Authority these are attached to this report as appendix 1. Clothing Collection Ltd were unable to produce accounts as they stated that they were a new company and that the first accounts will be available next year.

6. Copies of the application were circulated to West Midlands Police and the Public Realm Directorate (Highways). These agencies raised no objections to the application.

Finance

7. There are no financial implications.

Law

8. House to house collection permits are governed by Section 2 of the House-to- House Collections Act 1939.
9. Council may refuse to grant a licence or where a licence has been granted may revoke it if it appears to the Authority:-
 - (a) that the total amount likely to be applied for charitable purposes as the result of the collection (including any amount already so applied) is inadequate in proportion to the value of the proceeds likely to be received (including any proceeds already received).
 - (b) that remuneration which is excessive in relation to the total amount aforesaid is likely to be, or has been, retained or received out of the proceeds of the collection by any person.
 - (c) that the grant of a licence would be likely to facilitate the commission of any offence under section three of the Vagrancy Act 1824, or that an offence under that section has been committed in connection with the collection.
 - (d) that the applicant or the holder of the licence is not a fit and proper person to hold a licence by reason of the fact that he has been convicted in the United Kingdom of any offences specified in the Schedule to this Act, or has been convicted in

any part of His Majesty's dominions of any offence conviction for which necessarily involved a finding that he acted fraudulently or dishonestly, or of any offence of a kind the commission of which would be likely to be facilitated by the grant of a licence.

- (e) that the applicant or the holder of the licence, in promoting a collection in respect of which a licence has been granted to him, has failed to exercise due diligence to secure that persons authorised by him to act as collectors for the purposes of the collection were fit and proper persons, to secure compliance on the part of persons so authorised with the provisions of regulations made under this Act, or to prevent prescribed badges or prescribed certificate of authority being obtained by persons other than persons so authorised.
 - (f) that the applicant or holder of the licence has refused or neglected to furnish to the authority such information as they may have reasonably required for the purpose of informing themselves as to any of the matters specified in the fore-going paragraphs.
10. If the Committee refuse to grant a licence or revoke a licence which has been granted. There is a right of appeal within 14 days to the Secretary of State against the refusal or revocation of licence.
