| Purpose | To inform the board about the proposed approach to the JSNA and agree way forward |
| Background | The purpose of Joint Strategic Needs Assessments (JSNAs) and Joint Health and Wellbeing Strategies (JHWSs) is to improve the health and wellbeing outcomes of the local community and reduce inequalities for all ages. Guidance has been provided for their preparation which is especially important as under the Health and Social Care Act 2012, JSNAs and Joint Health and Wellbeing Strategy forms the basis of Integrated Care Board (previously required by Clinical Commissioning Groups), the NHS Commissioning Board and local authority commissioning plans, across all local health, social care, public health and children's services. The JSNA and JHWS process is crucial to the system in order to make real improvements to the health and wellbeing of local people |
